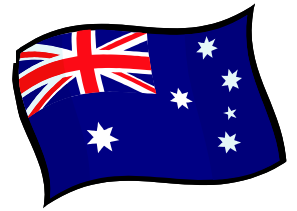

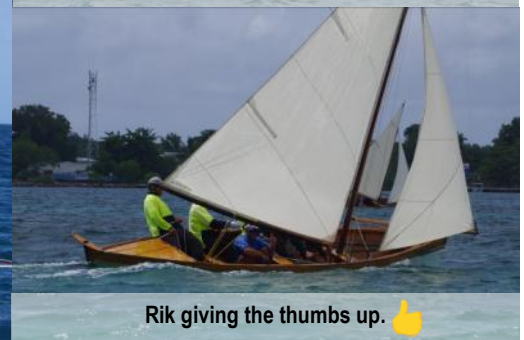

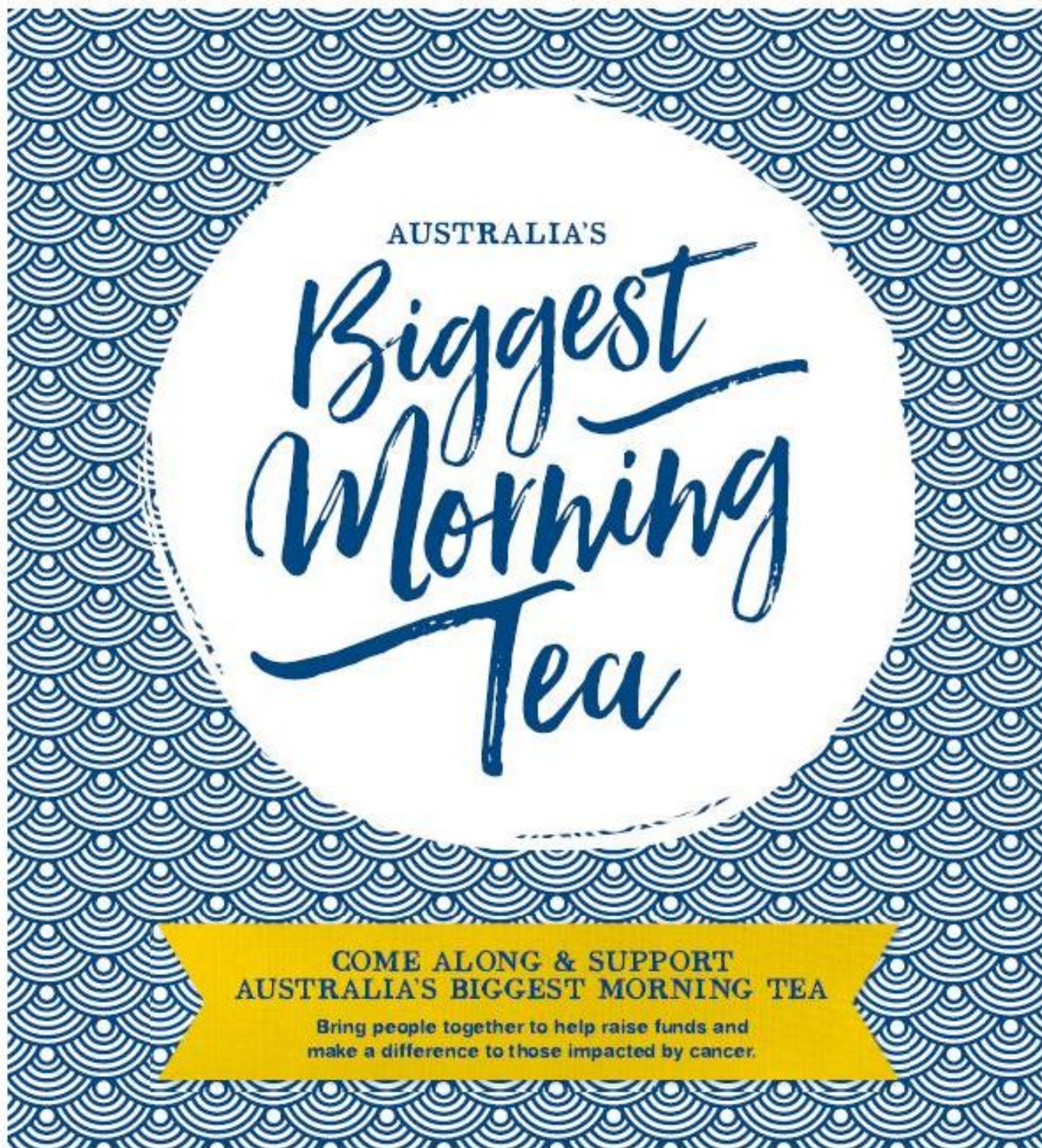
Wednesday 18th April 2018 - 8.00am

Simple Ways to Green Your Beauty Routine.

Cut down on chemicals and give yourself an easy green makeover with these simple tips!

Ignore the Marketing Claims and Look at Labels-

You would be amazed (and outraged) at the number of products marketed "for sensitive skin" that contain allergens and skin toxicants! Ignore the claims on the front of the package. Flip the product over and look at the label.

Simplify, Simplify, Simplify-

When it comes to synthetic chemical exposures, less is better than more. Choose products with shorter ingredient lists and fewer or no synthetic chemicals. Scan for common chemicals such as sodium lauryl/laureth sulfate, parabens, diethanolamine (DEA), triethanolamine (TEA), diazolidinyl and imidazolidinyl urea, PEGs, quaternium 15 and fragrance — if a product contains any of these synthetics, it is a likely bet that you will be inhaling, ingesting or absorbing unnecessary toxins into your body.

Use Less Stuff-

Before slathering a product on your body or spraying it around your home, it's worth asking: Do I really need this? Air freshener? (Open a window.) Bubble bath? (Not a good idea to sit in a tub full of chemicals for long periods of time.) Also, companies like to make us think we need a separate lotion for each part of our bodies and a different cleaning product for every room in the house, but a healthier (and less expensive) option is to buy one nontoxic product you can feel good about using.

CHRISTMAS ISLAND AND THE COCOS (KEELING) ISLANDS – CREATING OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE FUTURE

PULU CHRISTMAS DAN PULU COCOS (KEELING) – MEMBUAT PELUANG UNTUK MASA HADAPAN

Saya sangat bergirang hati untuk dilantik sebagai Federal Minister untuk Regional Development, Territories and Local Government. Saya menunggukan untuk bekerjasama dengan masyarakat di Pulu Christmas dan Pulu Cocos (Keeling) untuk menyokong perkembangan ekonomik, kebolehan kehidupan dan kemakmuran.

Sebagai wakil daripada masyarakat saya di Toowoomba di Queensland, saya bersemangat tentang menyokong dan mewakili Australians dimasyarakat regional. Setelah diundi sebagai wakil untuk daerah saya dikebelangan tahun ini, di council tempatan, taraf state government dan federal government, saya biasa dengan keluasan dan kedalaman serbis-serbis yang boleh membuat perbezaan ditempatan. Saya berbangga kerana telah menyokong untuk masyarakat saya dan menyumbang kepada pusat regional yang kuat dan giat. Sebelum memasuk politik, saya mempunyai latarbelakang petanian dengan keluarga, kareer yang memuaskan dalam agribusiness, dan menjalankan bisnis erundingan pengurusan untuk bisnis-bisnis dan bidang-bidang di regional Australia.

Kedua-dua Pulu Christmas dan Cocos (Keeling) mempunyai sejarah yang panjang dan membanggakan, dan masyarakat antarabangsa yang kuat dan berdinamik. Saya menunggukan untuk melawati pulu-pulu ini dan berbincangkan perkara-perkara yang boleh membuat perbezaan kepada penduduk, Shire tempatan, bisnis-bisnis dan persatuan-persatuan pulu.

Pulu Christmas sedang dalam perjalanan masa petukaran. Sebagai Minister baru kamu, saya berkomitment untuk bekerjasama dengan kamu untuk menyokong transition kamu kedalam masa hadapan ekonomik baru. Kerajaan telah memberikan \$100,000 kepada Regional Development Organisation untuk membuat Strategic Plan untuk Pulu Christmas. Diketuakan oleh Administrator, Mrs Natasha Griggs, Strategic Plan akan disediakan dalam kerjasama dengan masyarakat dan mencerminkan tujuan, matlamat dan cita-cita kamu. Saya menunggukan untuk bekerja dengan Administrator, Shire kamu, bisnis-bisnis dan masyarakat untuk memajukan kepingan kerjaan yang penting ini.

Pelepasan tanah Crown di Pulu Christmas akan menyokong aktiviti ekonomik. Saya berbesar hati dengan balasan daripada panggilan tunjuk minat Kerajaan untuk tanah Crown, dengan projek-projek inovatif dalam pelancongan, fasilitas penjualan dan masyarakat yang dicadangkan oleh responden. Keutamaan saya ialah untuk menyelesaikan pengurusan untuk serahan tanah Crown dan saya mengharapkan untuk membuat pengumuman tentang langkah-langkah dalam proses-proses dimasa hadapan. Ekonomi di Pulu Cocos (Keeling) juga memberikan peluang untuk perkembangan, dan kunci keutamaan ialah perkembangan Strategic Plan dalam 2018-19.

Termasuknya Indian Ocean Territories dalam network Regional Development Australia baru-baru ini akan menyokong aktiviti ekonomik dan perbezaan, dan menggalakkan peningkatan investment. Regional Investment Officer akan bekerja rapat dengan bisnis-bisnis tempatan dan Shire untuk membantu membuat kerjaan, menarik bisnis investment dan perkembangan ekonomi.

Regional Investment Officer juga akan bekerja dengan kumpulan masyarakat tempatan untuk membuat lamaran duit bantuan yang kuat dan kompetitif, membawa duit bantuan yang lebih ke pulu.

Saya memahami kedua-dua territories sangat-sangat cantik, dengan Pulu Christmas menampilkan tumbuhan dan binatang tempatan yang unik dan landscape yang dramatik. Pulu Cocos (Keeling) dikenali sebagai destinasi yang tenang dan tempat 'panti terbaik' (2017) di Australia dan olahraga ayer yang hebat. Kerajaan Australia memberikan duit bantuan kedua-dua persatuan pelancongan untuk menyokong mereka dalam mengembangkan pulu-pulu ini ke pasaran diseluruh negeri dan luar negeri. Kerajaan Australia juga mempertanggungkan serbis penerbangan kedua-dua pulu dan sedang bekerja dengan pemberi serbis ini, Virgin Australia, untuk menambah komunikasi dengan masyarakat, bisnis-bisnis dan penumpang-penumpang bersama. Membangunkan pelancongan, dan membuat perbagaian pengalaman untuk pelancong-pelancong, akan menyokong perkembangan dalam kedua-dua ekomoni tempatan.

Saya berjumpa dengan Administrator dimasa pelawatannya ke Canberra kebelakangan ini. Dia adalah penganjur yang kuat untuk territories dan penyokong yang bersemangat masyarakat kamu. Pintu Natasha senantiasa terbuka dan saya menggalakkan sesiapa yang berminat untuk terus menyokong masyarakat kamu untuk hubungi opisnya.

Dari pandangan peribadi, Saya menunggukan peluang untuk memimpin tugas Kerajaan dalam memberikan serbis-serbis kepada territories luaran Australia. Saya membawa penghargaan terhadap cabaran dalam regional dan remote Australia, usaha untuk melaksanakan tindakan keutamaan Kerajaan, dan tanggungjawab untuk bekerjasama dengan penduduk dan bisnis-bisnis untuk mengembangkan ekonomi tempatan, membuat kerjaan dan memperbaiki infrastruktur. Healthy Living Tip

Baby Eating

Young children don't experience stress-driven or emotional eating, or the influences of friends and media. Here are some tips on how baby eats.

- They eat only when they're hungry. We don't always follow that ourselves—we're busy, we're stressed, we're bored—and that can lead to overeating. Babies eat when they're hungry and stop when they're full.

- They don't skip meals. Not unless they're sick, sleeping, or already full, anyway.

- They eat snacks. Nutritious snacks too, like fresh fruit, baby-friendly veggies, and whole grains.

- They're picky about what they eat. And how! Babies know what they like and won't waste time eating something that's just meh. Lesson: When you like what you're eating, you'll likely enjoy it and feel more satisfied overall.

- They eat slowly. They're still figuring out how to get that noodle into their mouths and chew it. Glassman says that chewing foods slowly helps increase the enzymes in your mouth, helping aid in better digestion.

Drug offences and you IX – Commonwealth drug offences – cultivating illegal plants for commercial purposes and selling illegal plants

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This is the ninth article about drug offences under state-based legislation that is applied to Christmas and Cocos (Keeling) Islands and under Commonwealth legislation.

This is the fifth article about Commonwealth drug offences – that is, offences under Commonwealth legislation. It is about cultivating illegal plants (these are called “controlled plants”) for commercial purposes and selling controlled plants.

Commonwealth drug offences are dealt with by the *Criminal Code Act 1995* (Cth) (we will call it the *Criminal Code* (Cth)) and the *Criminal Code Regulations 2002* (Cth) (we will call them the *Regulations*).

What is a “controlled plant?”

The *Criminal Code* (Cth) defines a “controlled plant” as one listed as such by a regulation, or one that is urgently determined by the Minister to be a controlled plant. The *Regulations* list only all the species of the genus *cannabis* as controlled plants. There are 3 species of *cannabis* generally recognised.

What is cultivating for “commercial purposes”?

You cultivate a plant for commercial purposes if you intend to sell any of the plant or its products or you believe that another person intends to do so.

When you can be presumed to be cultivating for commercial purposes

If you cultivate a trafficable number of controlled plants, you can be presumed to be cultivating for commercial purposes ie with the intention to sell or believing someone else will. The trafficable quantity is set out in the schedule in the *Regulations* that lists controlled plants. A trafficable number is 10 plants or more.

You can rebut (cancel) the presumption if you can prove that you did not have that intention or belief. The standard of proof is just on the balance of probabilities, which means just greater than 50 percent, or more likely than not.

What is “cultivating”?

You cultivate if you:

- plant a seed, cutting or seedling or transplant a plant
- nurture, tend or grow, or guard or hide a plant
- harvest or pick any part of a plant or separate any resin or other substance from it.

What is “cultivating a plant”?

You cultivate a plant if you:

- engage in its cultivation, or
- control or direct its cultivation, or
- provide finance for its cultivation.

“Marketable” and “commercial” numbers of controlled plants

In general terms, you can be charged with, for commercial purposes, cultivating a controlled plant (the least serious charge), or cultivating a “marketable” number of controlled plants (a more serious charge), or cultivating a “commercial” number of controlled plants (the most serious charge).

The schedule in the *Regulations* that lists the controlled plant (the 3 *cannabis* species) also sets out the numbers that constitute marketable and commercial quantities. One hundred or more *cannabis* plants is a marketable number of plants. One thousand or more *cannabis* plants is a commercial number of plants.

Cultivating controlled plants for commercial purposes – the offences

If you cultivate, for commercial purposes, a controlled plant or plants, you commit an offence. The maximum penalty is imprisonment for 10 years and/or 2,000 PUs (A penalty unit (PU) is currently \$210). This offence can be dealt with by a Magistrates Court if both the accused person and the prosecution agree.

If you cultivate, for commercial purposes, a marketable number of controlled plants, the maximum penalty is imprisonment for 25 years and/or 5,000 PUs. This offence is indictable only. This means that it can only be dealt with by the District Court and not by the Magistrates Court.

If you cultivate, for commercial purposes, a commercial number of controlled plants, the maximum penalty is imprisonment for life and/or 7,500 PUs. This offence is indictable only and can only be dealt with by the Supreme Court, and not by the District Court, because the maximum penalty is life imprisonment.

Selling controlled plants

It is an offence to sell a controlled plant. “Selling” includes agreeing to sell and also bartering or exchanging. The maximum penalty for selling a controlled plant or plants, is imprisonment for 10 years and/or 2,000 PUs. This offence can be dealt with by a Magistrates Court if both the accused person and the prosecution agree.

The maximum penalty for selling a marketable number of controlled plants, is imprisonment for 25 years and/or 5,000 PUs. This offence is indictable only and can only be dealt with by the District Court.

The maximum penalty for selling a commercial number of controlled plants, is imprisonment for life and/or 7,500 PUs. This offence is indictable only and can only be dealt with by the Supreme Court, because the maximum penalty is life imprisonment.

In the next article we will talk about the commercial manufacture of illegal drugs.

Pelanggaran drug dan kamu VIII – Pelanggaran drug menurut Commonwealth – menanam tumbuhan terlarang untuk tujuan jualan commercial dan menjual tumbuhan terlarang

Ini adalah majalah pendek tentang perkara-perkaperundangan yang mungkin menarik perhatian kamu. Ia bukan nasihat legal. Kamu harus selalu mengambil nasihat legal tersendiri untuk keadaan kamu.

Ini majalah yang ke sembilan tentang pelanggaran drug menurut perundangan berdasarkan state yang digunakan di Pulu Christmas dan Cocos (Keeling) dan dibawa perundangan Commonwealth.

Ini majalah yang lima tentang pelanggaran drug menurut Commonwealth – iaitu, pelanggaran dibawa undang-undang Commonwealth. Ia tentang pelanggaran penanaman tumbuhan terlarang (ini dipanggil "tumbuhan yang dijaga") untuk tujuan commercial dan menjual tumbuhan yang dijaga.

Criminal Code Act 1995 (Cth) (kita akan memanggil Criminal Code (Cth) dan Criminal Code Regulations 2002 (Cth) (kita akan memanggil Regulations) berurusan dengan pelanggaran drug menurut Commonwealth.

What is a "tumbuhan yang dijaga"?

Criminal Code (Cth) menerangkan "tumbuhan terjaga" sebagai salahsatu yang didaftarkan oleh sebuah undang-undang, atau satu yang dengan segera dinyatakan oleh Menteri sebagai tumbuhan yang dijaga. Daftar dalam Perundangan menerangkan semua jenis-jenis 'genus cannabis' sebagai tumbuhan yang dijaga. Ada 3 jenis cannabis yang biasa dikenali.

Apa itu menanam untuk "tujuan commercial"?

Kamu menanam tumbuhan untuk tujuan commercial jika kamu berniat untuk menjual tumbuhan itu ataupun produk daripadanya atau kamu percaya yang orang lain bertujuan untuk berbuat demikian.

Bila kamu boleh dianggap untuk menanam untuk tujuan commercial

Kalau kamu menanam tumbuhan yang dijaga yang berjumlah perdagangan, kamu boleh dianggap untuk menanam untuk tujuan jualan commercial, iaitu dengan tujuan untuk menjual atau percaya orang yang akan menjualnya. Jumlah perdagangan diterangkan dalam daftar dalam Perundangan yang menerangkan tumbuhan yang dijaga. Jumlah perdagangan ialah 10 tumbuhan keratas.

Kamu boleh membatalkan anggapan ini kalau boleh buktikan yang kamu tidak bertujuan atau percaya yang orang lain akan jualan. Standard bukti ialah hanya di balance kemungkinan, yang bermaksud hanya lebih dari 50 peratus, atau lebih kemungkinan tidak.

Apa itu "menanam"?

Kamu menanam jika kamu:

- menanam biji, cangkok'an, cutting atau anak pokok atau memindahkan tumbuhan
- memelihara, merawat atau menumbuh, atau menjaga atau menyemunikkan
- harvest atau memetik bahagian dari tumbuhan atau mengasingkan segala resin atau benda daripadanya.

Apa itu "penanaman tumbuhan"?

Kamu menanam tumbuhan jika kamu:

- mengambil bahagian dalam penanaman, atau
- kontrol atau mengurus penanaman, atau
- memberi kewangan untuk penanaman.

Jumlah "Jualan" dan "jualan commercial" tumbuhan yang dijaga

Secara umumnya, kamu boleh didakwa dengan, untuk tujuan jualan commercial, menanam tumbuhan yang dijaga (dakwaan ringan), atau menanam jumlah untuk "jualan" tumbuhan yang dijaga (dakwaan yang lebih berat), atau menanam jumlah "jualan commercial" tumbuhan yang dijaga (dakwaan yang paling berat).

Daftar dalam Perundangan yang menerangkan tumbuhan yang dijaga (3 jenis cannabis) juga menerangkan jumlah yang digelarkan untuk jualan dan jualan commercial. Satu ratus atau lebih tumbuhan cannabis ialah jumlah jualan. Satu ribu atau lebih tumbuhan cannabis ialah jumlah jualan commercial.

Menanam tumbuhan yang dijaga untuk tujuan jualan commercial - pelanggarannya

Kalau kamu menanam, untuk tujuan jualan commercial, sebuah tumbuhan terjaga, kamu membuat pelanggaran. Hukuman maksimum adalah penjara 10 tahun dan/atau 2,000 PUs (Sebuah unit hukuman pada masa sekarang ialah \$210). Pelanggaran ini boleh diurus oleh Magistrates Court jika kedua-dua orang yang didakwa dan pendakwaanya bersetuju.

Kalau kamu menanam, untuk tujuan jualan commercial, tumbuhan yang dijaga jumlah perdagangan, hukuman maksimum ialah penjara untuk 25 tahun dan/atau 5,000 PUs. Pelanggaran ini boleh didakwa sahaja. Ini bermaksud yang ia hanya boleh diurus oleh District Court dan bukan oleh Magistrates Court.

Kalau kamu menanam, tumbuhan yang dijaga, untuk jualan commercial, hukuman maksimum adalah dipenjarakan seumur hidup dan/atau 7,500 PUs. Pelanggaran ini adalah dakwaan saja dan hanya boleh diurus di Supreme Court, dan bukan oleh District Court, bersebab hukuman maksimum ialah penjara seumur hidup.

Menjual tumbuhan yang dijaga

Satu pelanggaran adalah kalau menjual tumbuhan yang dijaga. "Menjual" termasuk persetujuan untuk menjual dan juga pertukaran. Hukuman maksimum untuk menjual tumbuhan atau pokok yang dijaga, ialah penjara untuk 10 tahun dan/atau 2,000 PUs. Pelanggaran ini boleh diurus oleh Magistrates Court kalau kedua-dua pihak yang didakwa dan pendakwaanya bersetuju.

Hukuman maksimum untuk menjual tumbuhan yang dijaga yang berjumlah perdagangan, ialah penjara untuk 25 tahun dan/atau 5,000 PUs. Pelanggaran ini adalah dakwaan saja dan hanya boleh diurus oleh District Court.

Hukuman maksimum untuk menjual jumlah jualan commercial tumbuhan yang dijaga, ialah dipenjarakan seumur hidup dan/atau 7,500 PUs. Pelanggaran ini dakwaan saja dan hanya boleh diurus oleh Supreme Court, sebab hukuman maksimum adalah dipenjarakan seumur hidup.

Dalam majalah seterusnya kami akan bincangkan tentang pembuatan/perdagangan drug-drug yang terlarang.

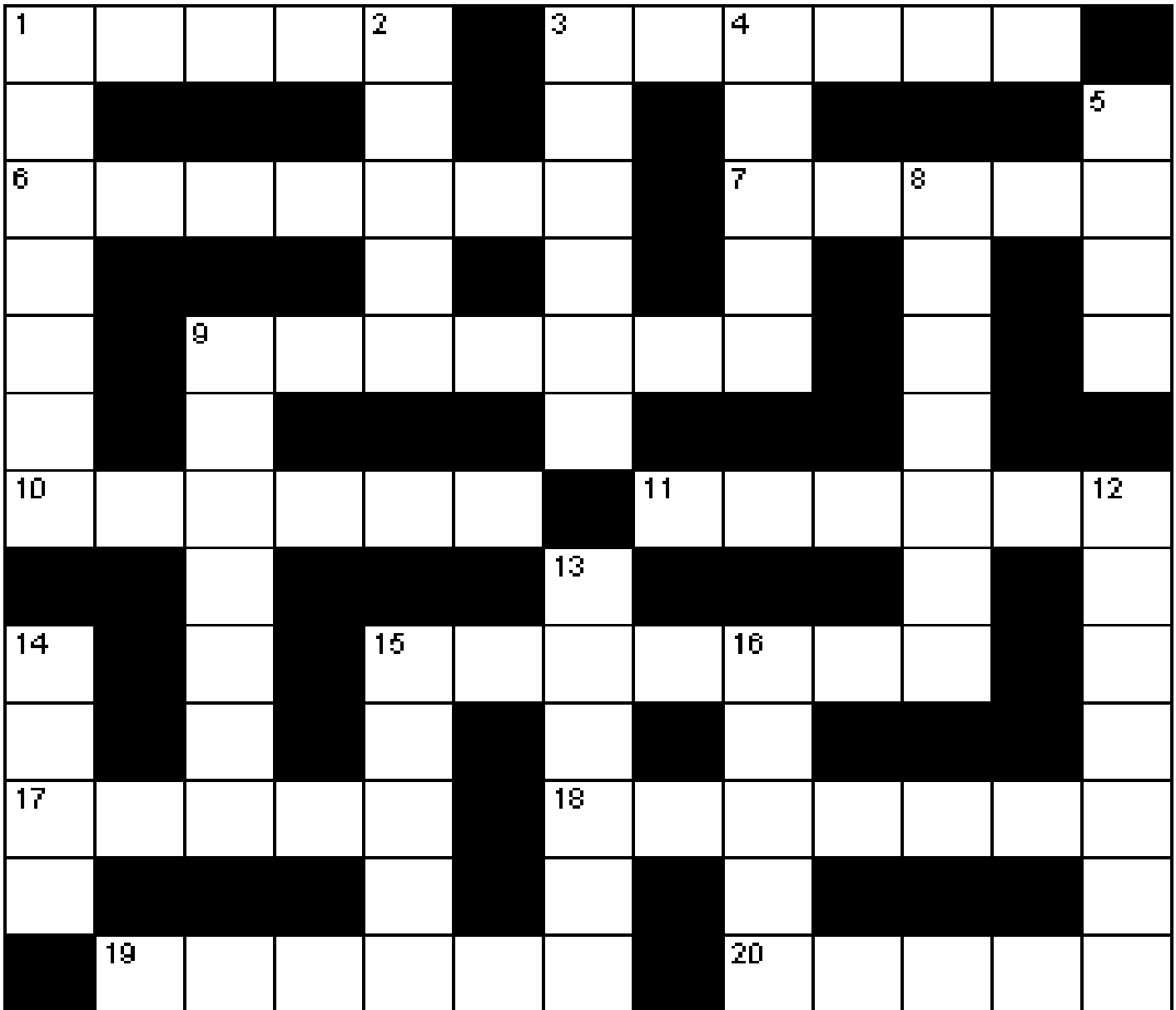

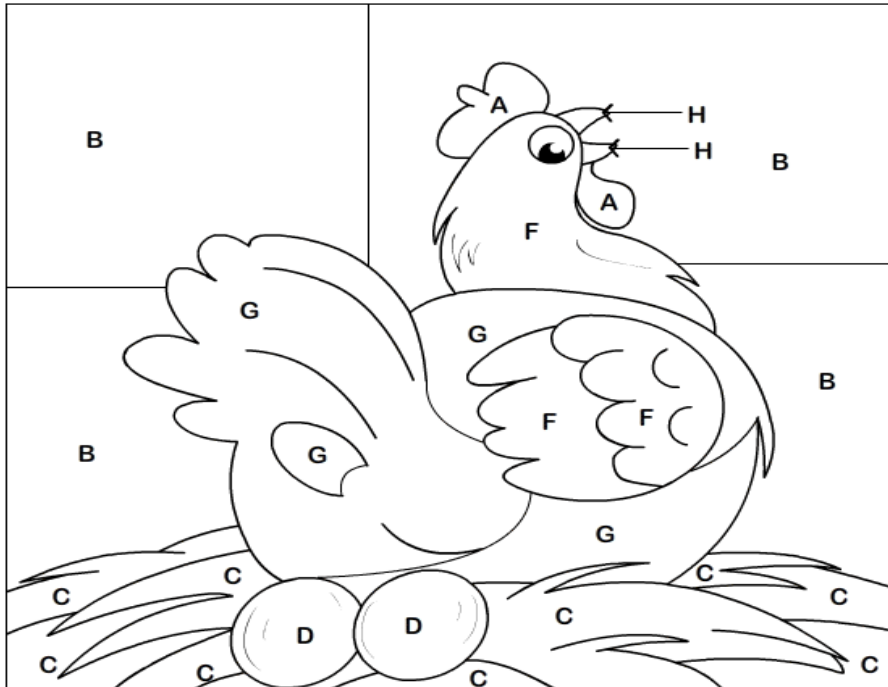
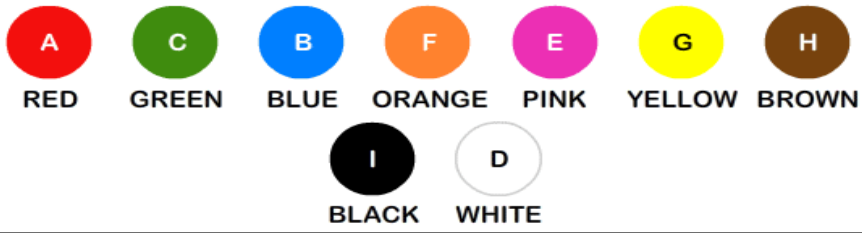
