ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM: The Shire has been working in partnership with the Visitor Centre to record oral histories from members of the community on Home Island over the past twelve months. Oral histories are an invaluable resource for current and future generations and provide a primary source of historical knowledge.

On Home Island we have been working in collaboration with Cocos Keeling Islands Visitor Centre and Parks Australia to support four Emerging Curators, Lanif Yakin, Siddiq Juljali, Shaniyah Kenneth and Amallia Alim in recording oral histories. To-date the four curators have interviewed eight Cocos Malay elders. The topics covered range from the art of jukung building to everyday life as experienced in the "olden days" as the elders refer to it, and the more significant events such as the Act of Self Determination.

We are grateful to the team at the Visitor Centre who are currently compiling all the interviews, having them translated into English and collecting old photos as reference to events discussed in the interviews.

We are now delighted to expand the program to commence gathering oral histories of people on West Island. It will be wonderful to have the stories of people who have contributed to the development of Cocos, to make it what it is today, captured for current and future generations to enjoy and learn from. These stories will be made available to the community via a variety of mediums, including at a community event in the coming weeks. If you have a Cocos story and would like to have your story recorded, please contact Isa Minkom at the Shire and we will arrange for you to be interviewed.

Isa is also keen to hear from people who would like to get involved as an interviewer or in assisting with transcribing the oral histories. Training and equipment will be provided.



FROM THE CEO'S DESK - 12 JUNE 2020



PROGRAM SEJARAH ORAL: Shire telah bekerjasama dengan Visitor Centre untuk merakam sejarah dari anggota masyarakat di Home Island sejak dua belas bulan terakhir. Sejarah oral adalah

sumber yang tidak ternilai untuk generasi semasa dan yang akan datang dan menyediakan sumber utama pengetahuan sejarah.

Di Home Island, kami telah bekerja sama dengan Cocos Keeling Islands Visitor Centre dan Parks Australia untuk mendukung empat Kurator yang muncul, Lanif Yakin, Siddiq Juljali, Shaniyah Kenneth, dan Mak Asif dalam merekod sejarah oral.

Sampai saat ini keempat kurator telah interview delapan nenek-nenek Melayu Cocos. Topik yang dibuat bermula dari membuat jukong hingga kehidupan sehari-hari seperti yang dialami pada "masa lalu" sebagaimana nenek-nenek menyebutnya, dan peristiwa yang lebih signifikan seperti Hari Tiga Pilihan.

Kami sekarang senang untuk memperluaskan program untuk memulai mengumpulkan sejarah oral orang-orang di Pulu Panjang. Akan luar biasa memiliki kisah-kisah tentang orang-orang yang telah berkontribusi pada



pengembangan Cocos, menjadikannya seperti sekarang ini, ditangkap oleh generasi sekarang dan masa depan untuk dinikmati dan dipelajari. Kisah-kisah ini akan tersedia untuk masyarakat melalui berbagai media, termasuk di acara masyarakat dalam beberapa minggu mendatang. Jika anda memiliki kisah Cocos dan ingin agar cerita anda direkod, silakan hubungi Isa Minkom di Shire dan kami akan mengatur agar anda diinterview.

Isa juga ingin mendengar dari orang-orang yang ingin terlibat sebagai pewawancara atau dalam membantu menuliskan sejarah oral. Pelatihan dan peralatan akan disediakan.

ARTS GROUP: Thank you to the small but passionate group of people who have registered to be on an informal group keen to assist the Shire in developing and implementing an arts and cultural program on Cocos. At the first meeting of the group we came up with several ideas we would like to progress together. Some of the ideas so far include an annual exhibition, art trail, workshops and artists in residence program, poetry in the pub, music and dance. MAJU PULU KITA MASTERPLAN PROJECTS: The Home Island Cyclone Shelter is a bit of a construction site this week as the shelter over the steps is being installed. Once installed this will provide a great venue for an outdoor cinema/theatre space and in the coming weeks, we will commence a program for the community to enjoy.

Recycling on Home Island was another priority project in the Maju Pulu Kita Masterplan so we were excited to receive the glass crusher and can crusher on the last ship. This equipment will be installed in the coming weeks. We will be delivering information on recycling to each household plus running a series of open days for community groups to have a look at the equipment in action.

PROJEK MASTERPLAN MAJU PULU KITA: Rumah Seklon di Home Island minggu ini seperti tempat pembinaan kerana tempat perlindungan di atas tangga sedang dipasang. Recycling di Home Island adalah satu lagi projek keutamaan dalam Maju Pulu Kita Masterplan, jadi kami sangat gembira menerima penghancur kaca dan belek di kapal yang lalu. Peralatan ini akan dipasang pada minggu-minggu mendatang. Kami akan menyampaikan maklumat mengenai recycling ke setiap rumah dan menjalankan beberapa hari terbuka bagi kumpulan masyarakat untuk melihat peralatan yang sedang beraksi.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 (WA) (CKI)
Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands
Proposed Local Law

The Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands proposes to adopt the following local law –

1. Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands Public Places and Local Government Property Local Law 2020.
- 2.

Purpose – to prescribe for the management of public places and thoroughfares, and all local government property.

Effect – to repeal the *Camping Local Law 2009* and establish necessary local government property controls for activities in public places including thoroughfares, and for the use of/provide for permitted and prohibited activities on local government property and create offences for non-compliance.

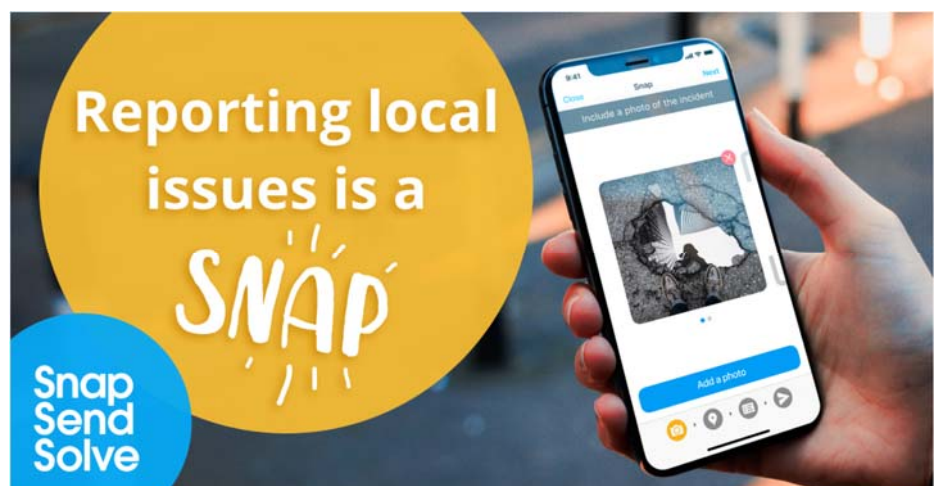

Home Island Gas Installation Inspections

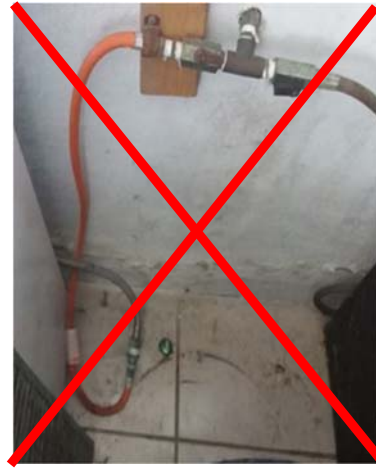
Steve Holdham Senior Gas Inspector of Building and Energy conducted inspection activities on 30 October 2019. These inspections are carried out to ensure that the gas installations are compliant with the Gas Standards Act 1972 and its Regulations.

Inspectors Orders had been issued from a previous visit in 2018 for non-compliances that have been commonly identified on Home Island. There is a concern that these defects are not being rectified and there are numerous gas installations in use that are non-compliant.

2019 inspections identified that the most common non-compliances are as per below examples. These would be required to be rectified for compliance under current Regulations and Standards:



LPG cylinders unrestrained and/or not installed on an appropriate base or base material.



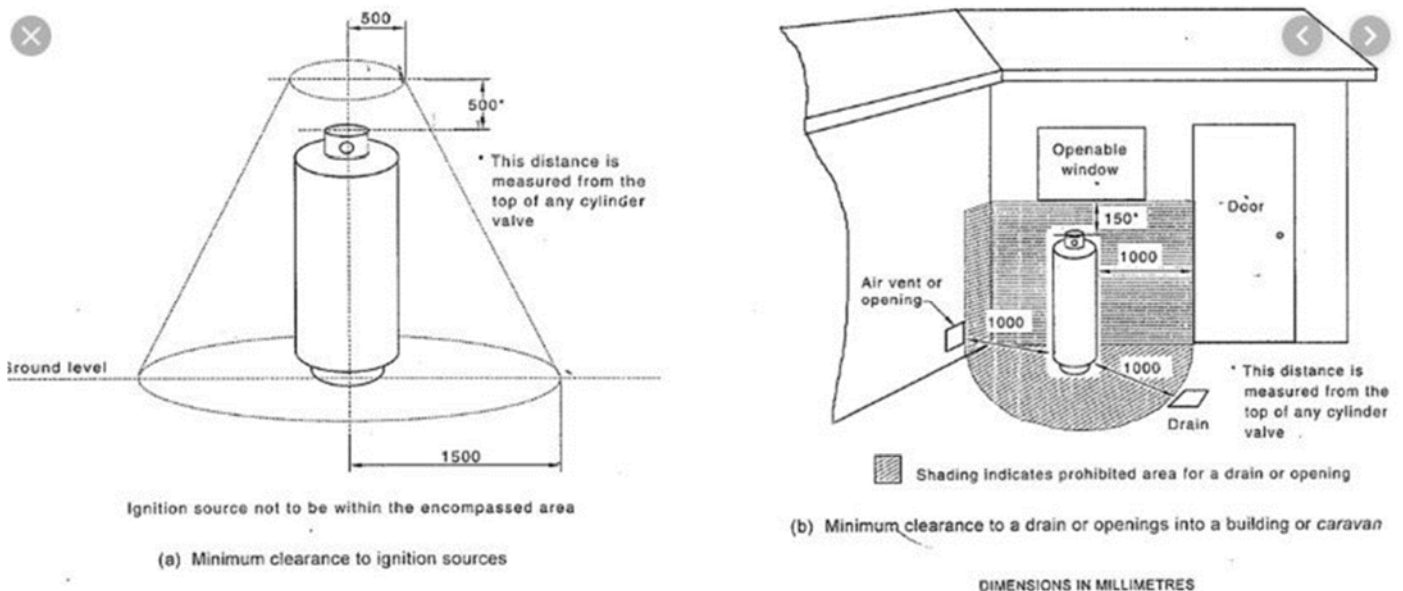
Flexible gas hose assemblies installed contrary to regulations.



Other common non-compliances identified include:

- LP Gas cylinders located too close to openings into buildings.
- LP Gas cylinders are prohibited from use indoors, appliances certified for outdoor use must only be used outdoors (camping style hot water units, cookers etc.)
- LP Gas cylinders too close to source of ignition.
- LP Gas cylinders gas/butane cartridge cookers located inside buildings.
- Appliance burners located too close to combustible materials.
- Inappropriate gas regulators (no overpressure protection).

Please see below diagram of the Regulations and Standards for gas installation requirements:



The Shire is working together with the senior gas inspector to ensure residents and business comply with current regulations and standards, in order to prevent unnecessary infringements and prosecutions.

Importantly it is about educating people to abide by the regulations to ensure potential risks and hazards are eliminated. Please be reminded that all gas installations can ONLY be done by a licensed gas fitter. An on the spot fine of \$2000 can be issued by the gas inspector for unauthorised gas fitting work.

More inspections shall take place in the near future, and any installations that were non-compliant before will be revisited and new orders will be issued for those properties relevant to any defects identified.

Community Update Pulu Keeling National Park



Notification of intention to bait yellow crazy ants

Parks Australia would like to notify the Cocos community of our intention to bait for yellow crazy ants on Pulu Blan Madar in the coming weeks. We have recently noticed exceptionally high numbers of crazy ants which have the potential to impact on the survivorship of the Christmas Island blue tail skinks. The baiting will only take 1-2 days but will be repeated 3 times, every 3 months. We will be using Fipronil based gel inside small containers which will only allow access to ants.

Despite efforts to keep Pulu Blan Madar rat free, we have had a recent rat incursion. We have installed 4 Good Nature traps both on Blan and Blan Madar to attempt to keep rat numbers at a minimum.

If visiting Pulu Blan or Blan Madar, please remember to check your boat for unwanted pests like rats, centipedes and paper wasps. It is critical for the survival of the skinks that the islands remain pest free.

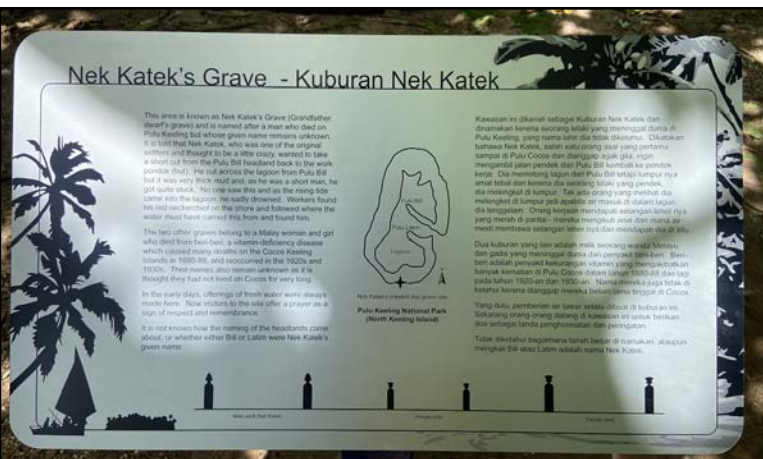

Pemberitahuan niat untuk mengumpam semut kuning

Parks Australia ingin memberitahu masyarakat Cocos tentang niat kami untuk mengumpam semut kuning di Pulu Blan Madar dalam beberapa minggu akan datang. Baru-baru ini, kami telah memperhatikan banyak semut kuning yang boleh memberi kesan kepada kehidupan cicak buntut biru Pulu Krismas yang masih hidup. Mengumpam hanya akan memakan masa 1-2 hari tetapi akan diulang 3 kali setiap 3 bulan. Kami akan menggunakan gel Fipronil di dalam tempat kotak kecil yang membolehkan hanya semut yang masuk.

Walaupun ada usaha untuk memastikan Pulu Blan Madar bebas dari tikus, kami baru-baru ini mengalami banyak tikus, kami telah memasang 4 jipah Good Nature di Blan dan Blan Madar untuk berusaha mengurangkan tikus pada minimal.

Sekiranya pigi di Pulu Blan atau Blan Madar, ingatlah untuk memeriksa sekoci anda untuk mencari binatang yang tidak diinginkan seperti tikus, alipan dan wasp. Sangat penting untuk kehidupan cicak buntut biru di pulu-pulu tetap bebas dari sebarang gangguan.

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

The social phenomenon of people distributing intimate images (for eg a nude photograph or video of sexual activity) of other people without their consent has become more common recently. It has been facilitated by the increasing use of social media and technology.

One common example is where one person sends their partner, whilst they are in a relationship, a nude photograph of themselves. Later, the relationship ends and the receiver of the photograph distributes that photograph to others, without their ex-partner's consent. It is often to humiliate their ex-partner and take revenge upon them.

Distributing an intimate image without consent became a criminal offence in WA and in the Indian Ocean Territories on 15 April 2019.

We will talk about the offence, definitions, penalties and rectification orders in the first article and defences to the charge and making a threat to distribute an intimate image and other things in the second article.

The offence and penalties

You commit a crime if you distribute an intimate image of another person who does not consent to the distribution. The offence can be dealt with by either the Magistrates or District Court (commonly called an "either way" offence).

[It must be dealt with by the Magistrates Court unless you or the Prosecutor ask for it to be dealt with by the District Court and the Magistrate agrees. The Magistrate must apply rules to determine whether it should be dealt with by the District Court.](#)

The maximum penalty is 3 years imprisonment if you are dealt with by the District Court ("on indictment"). The maximum penalty is 18 months imprisonment and a fine of \$18,000 if you are dealt with by the Magistrates Court.

What is an "intimate image"?

An intimate image is either a still or moving image (eg photo or video, including photoshopped or edited images) that shows, where a person would normally expect to have privacy:

- A person's genital or anal area, either bare, or covered by underwear or
- For a female, or person identifying as female, her breasts, either bare or covered by underwear or
- The person engaged in a private act (see below).

Note that it would not include situations where a person does not expect to have privacy, such as a model modelling underwear in a lingerie fashion parade.

What is a "private act"?

A private act is where a person is:

- in a state of undress
- having a shower, or bathing, or using the toilet or
- engaged in a sexual act.

What is consent?

Consent is real agreement. Consent must be freely and voluntarily given. It is not freely and voluntarily given if it is obtained by force, threat, intimidation, or deceit. For example, consenting because the distributor threatened that he would show nude photographs of you to your parents unless you let him send them to his mates would not be consent.

Consent on one occasion does not mean consent for other occasions. Consent given to one person does not provide consent to other persons. Consent to one particular form of distribution does not provide consent to other forms of distribution.

Also, distribution by the person in the image does not provide consent for further distribution by other people.

Court can order person charged to rectify (remove) the distribution of the intimate image

If a person is charged with the offence, a Court can order that person to take reasonable steps to get rid of (remove, delete, destroy) the intimate image within a certain time frame. This is called a rectification order. It does not matter if a person is convicted of the offence or not.

For example, if an accused person has sent a photograph of an ex-girlfriend who is naked to his friend, without her consent, a Court might make a rectification order at his first Court appearance. The order might be that he deletes the photograph within 48 hours. This order can be made even if he eventually pleads not guilty and is found not guilty of the offence.

If the person fails to comply with a rectification order, it is a simple offence (which means it can only be dealt with by the Magistrates Court). The maximum penalty is imprisonment for 12 months and a fine of \$12,000.

What if you send an intimate image of yourself?

If you are an adult, this is not a criminal offence. It is only a criminal offence if you distribute an intimate image of someone else, without their consent.

If you are under 18 years, it can be an offence to distribute an intimate image of yourself. You can be charged with an offence under child pornography laws.

Ini adalah berita pendek mengenai masalah undang-undang yang mungkin menarik bagi [anda](#). Ini bukan nasihat undang-undang. Anda harus selalu mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang masing-masing untuk keadaan anda.

Fenomena sosial orang yang menyebarkan gambar intim (contohnya gambar telanjang atau video aktiviti seksual) orang lain tanpa persetujuan mereka menjadi lebih biasa baru-baru ini. Ini telah difasilitasi oleh peningkatan penggunaan media sosial dan teknologi.

Salah satu contoh umum adalah di mana seseorang menghantar pasangan mereka, semasa mereka menjalinkan hubungan, gambar diri mereka yang telanjang. Kemudian, hubungan berakhir dan penerima gambar menyebarkan gambar itu kepada orang lain, tanpa persetujuan bekas pasangan mereka. Selalunya menghina bekas pasangan mereka dan membalas dendam terhadap mereka.

Menyebarkan gambar intim tanpa persetujuan menjadi kesalahan jenayah di WA dan di Wilayah Lautan Hindi pada 15 April 2019.

Kami akan membicarakan kesalahan, maksud, hukuman dan perintah pembetulan dalam artikel pertama dan pertahanan terhadap pertuduhan dan membuat ancaman untuk menyebarkan gambar intim dan perkara lain dalam artikel kedua.

Kesalahan dan hukuman Anda melakukan kejahatan jika anda menyebarkan gambar intim orang lain yang tidak bersetuju dengan pendedaran itu. Kesalahan tersebut dapat ditangani oleh Majistret atau District Court (biasanya disebut sebagai kesalahan "apa pun").

[Perkara itu mesti ditangani oleh Mahkamah Majistret melainkan anda atau Penuntut meminta agar perkara itu ditangani oleh District Court dan Majistret bersetuju. Majistret mesti menggunakan peraturan untuk menentukan sama ada ia harus ditangani oleh District Court.](#)

Hukuman maksimum adalah penjara 3 tahun jika anda diadili oleh District Court ("atas dakwaan"). Hukuman maksimum adalah penjara 18 bulan dan denda \$18,000 jika anda ditangani oleh Mahkamah Majistret.

Apa itu "gambar intim"? Gambar intim adalah gambar diam atau bergerak (contohnya foto atau video, termasuk gambar yang dipotong atau diedit) yang menunjukkan, di mana seseorang biasanya mengharapkan privasi:

- Kawasan kemaluan atau dubur seseorang, sama ada telanjang, atau ditutup dengan seluar dalam atau
- Untuk perempuan, atau orang yang dikenali sebagai perempuan, payudaranya, telanjang atau ditutupi dengan coli atau
- Orang yang melakukan perbuatan pribadi (lihat di bawah).

Perhatikan bahawa itu tidak termasuk situasi di mana seseorang tidak mengharapkan kerahsiaan, seperti model memodelkan pakaian dalam didalam fesyen pakaian dalam.

Apa itu "tindakan pribadi"?

Perbuatan pribadi adalah dimana seseorang:

- dalam keadaan membukak pakaian
- mandi, atau menggunakan tandas atau
- terlibat dalam perbuatan seksual.

Apa itu persetujuan? Persetujuan adalah perjanjian sebenar. Persetujuan mesti diberikan secara bebas dan sukarela. Ia tidak diberikan secara bebas dan sukarela jika ia diperoleh secara paksa, ancaman, intimidasi, atau penipuan. Contohnya, memberi persetujuan kerana pendedar mengancam bahawa dia akan menunjukkan gambar telanjang anda kepada ibu bapa anda melainkan anda membiarkannya menghantarnya kepada kawan nya tidak akan mendapat persetujuan.

Persetujuan pada satu kesempatan tidak bermaksud persetujuan untuk yang lain. Persetujuan yang diberikan kepada satu orang tidak memberikan persetujuan kepada orang lain. Persetujuan untuk satu cara pendedaran tertentu tidak memberikan persetujuan kepada cara pendedaran lain.

Juga, pendedaran oleh orang dalam gambar tidak memberikan persetujuan untuk pendedaran lebih lanjut oleh orang lain.

Mahkamah boleh memerintahkan orang yang ditugaskan untuk membetulkan (membuang) penyebaran gambar intim

Sekiranya seseorang didakwa atas kesalahan itu, Mahkamah dapat memerintahkan orang itu untuk mengambil langkah untuk menyingkirkan (menghapus, memusnahkan) gambar intim dalam jangka masa tertentu. Ini dipanggil perintah pembetulan. Tidak kira sama ada seseorang itu dihukum atas kesalahan itu atau tidak.

Sebagai contoh, jika seseorang yang dituduh telah menghantar gambar bekas kekasihnya yang telanjang kepada kawannya, tanpa persetujuannya, Mahkamah mungkin akan membuat perintah pembetulan pada kali pertama kali muncul di Mahkamah. Perintahnya mungkin dia akan menghapus gambar tersebut dalam 48 jam. Perintah ini boleh dibuat walaupun dia akhirnya mengaku tidak bersalah dan didapati tidak melakukan kesalahan itu.

Sekiranya orang tersebut tidak mematuhi perintah pembetulan, itu adalah kesalahan yang mudah (yang bermaksud ia hanya boleh ditangani oleh Mahkamah Majistret). Hukuman maksimum adalah penjara selama 12 bulan dan denda \$12,000.

Bagaimana jika anda menghantar gambar intim anda? Sekiranya anda seorang dewasa, ini bukan kesalahan jenayah. Ini hanya kesalahan jenayah jika anda menyebarkan gambar intim orang lain, tanpa persetujuan mereka.

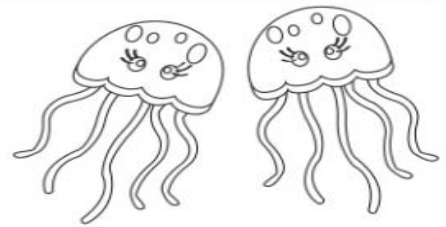
Sekiranya anda berusia di bawah 18 tahun, boleh menjadi kesalahan untuk menyebarkan gambar intim diri anda. Anda boleh didakwa atas kesalahan di bawah undang-undang pornografi kanak-kanak.

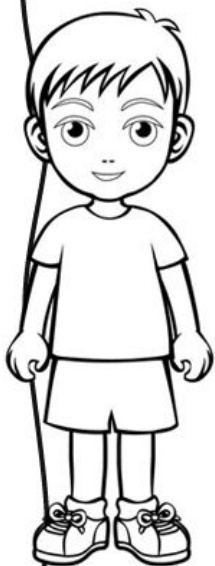

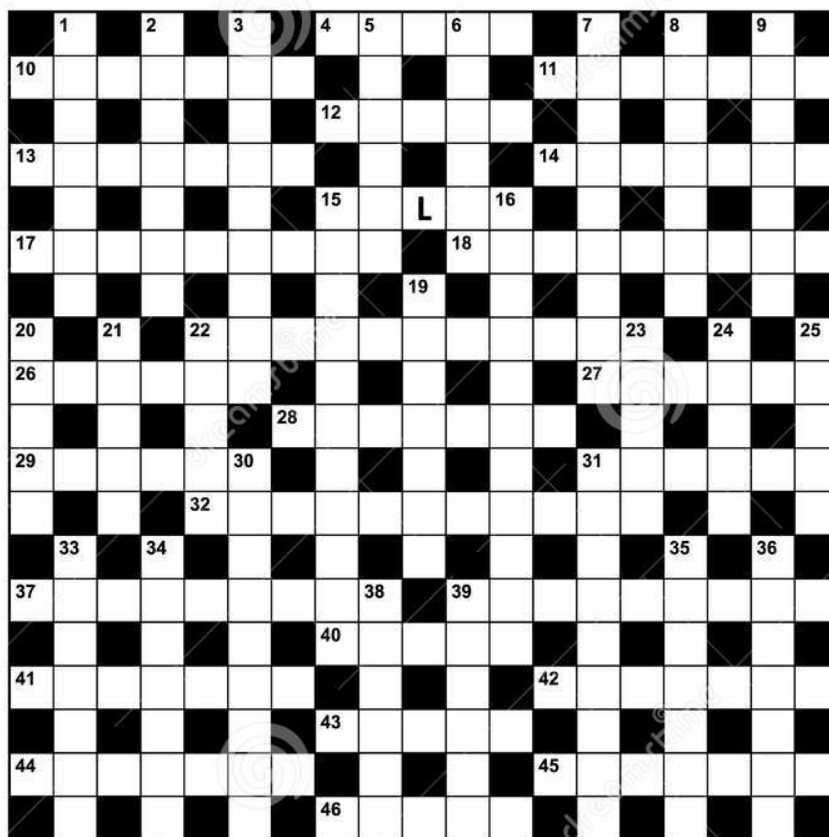
