VADALISM OF HOME ISLAND CRC TOILETS

It has come to the Shire's attention that the public toilets in the Home Island Community Resource Centre has been vandalised in 2 separate occasions, most recently this past weekend.

The Shire have expended many hours to create a facility that is worthwhile for the community. Those doing the vandalising may see these actions as fun however it has required urgent repairs to be done by Shire staffs to rectify the blocked toilets and general tidy up which have incurred costs.

It is disappointing that such foolish crimes exists in such a small community and towards a popular facility. As such the Shire will not tolerate such behaviour. In disappointment the Shire has reported this crime to the Australian Federal Police. As a last resort the Shire will be required to reluctantly lock these facilities after hours should these crimes continue which will no doubt be of disadvantage to the community.

Should someone in the community know the people responsible for these crimes, please notify the Chief Executive Officer or AFP in confidence so that this issue can be dealt with appropriately.

PENCEROBOHAN JAMBAN CRC HOME ISLAND

Sudah dalam perhatian Shire yang jamban-jamban umum di Home Island Community Resource Centre telah dicebohkan dalam 2 kali kejadian, paling baru-baru ini di minggu yang lewat.

Shire telah menggunakan masa yang banyak untuk membuatkan tempat yang berguna untuk masyarakat ini. Mereka-mereka yang membuat kerosakkan ini mungkin menganggap sikap mereka sebagai perkara yang menyenangkan, tetapi perbuatan mereka telah memerlukan repair dengan segera yang dibuat oleh pekerja Shire untuk membetulkan jamban yang tersumbat dan mengemaskan tempat yang juga telah memakan ongkos.

Kejadian ini mengecewakan kerana didapati pelanggaran sebodoh ini berlaku dalam masyarakat sekecil ini dan terhadap tempat yang sering digunakan dalam masyarakat. Oleh kerana itu Shire tidak akan membiarkan sahaja tingkahlaku sedemikian. Dalam kecewaan Shire telah terpaksa untuk melaporkan kesalahan ini kepada Australian Federal Police. Sebagai tindakan terakhir, Shire akan perlu dengan berat hati mengunci tempat ini kalau kejadian ini berterusan dan sudah tentu kalau dikunci akan menjadi kerugian bagi masyarakat ini.

Jika ada sesiapa dalam masyarakat ini yang tahu orang-orang yang bertanggungjawab atas pencerobohan tersebut, tolong beritahu Chief Executive Officer atau AFP dalam cara rahasia supaya perkara ini dalam di uruskan secara yang patut.

The Indian Ocean Territories Administration (IOTA) is seeking a motivated, professional and suitably qualified Electrical Superintendent to join our Indian Ocean Territories Power Service (IOTPS) team based on Christmas Island.

IOTPS is responsible for the generation and distribution of a safe, reliable and efficient electricity supply to residential, commercial and industrial consumers across the Indian Ocean Territories of Christmas and Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

The key responsibility for the Electrical Superintendent is to manage both network operations and electrical asset maintenance for generation and distribution giving emphasis to asset management, project management and maintenance planning. In addition, the successful person would be conversant with the necessary Electrical Acts and Regulations and ensure compliance with regulatory requirements for all electrical work performed in the territories on behalf of Energy Safety WA.

To be considered for the position, applicants must hold a current, valid Western Australia *Electrical Workers' Licence* (or ability to obtain same) with proven industrial electrical experience in a power utilities context. Drug offences and you II – offences to do with prohibited plants

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This is the second in several articles about drug offences under state-based legislation that is applied to Christmas and Cocos (Keeling) Islands and under Commonwealth legislation. The first few articles will be about offences under the state-based *Misuse of Drugs Act 1981* (WA)(CI). We will call it the Act.

In the first article we talked about prohibited drugs and premises and drug paraphernalia. In this article we will talk about criminal offences to do with prohibited plants under the Act.

What are prohibited plants?

The Act defines these as any plant from which a drug of addiction may be made, and plants listed in Schedule 2 of the Act (2 types of poppies and cannabis). A “drug of addiction” is further defined in the Act.

Offences to do with prohibited plants

A person can be charged with a simple offence of possessing or cultivating a prohibited plant. A simple offence can only be dealt with by the Magistrates Court and not a higher court. This offence attracts a maximum fine of \$2,000 and/or imprisonment of up to 2 years.

Sell or supply, or offer to sell or supply, a prohibited plant or drug obtained from it, or possession with intent to sell or supply a prohibited plant or drug obtained from it

This is a more serious charge. Under this section of the Act, you can be charged with selling or supplying a prohibited plant, or the drug obtained from it. You can also be charged with offering to sell or supply a prohibited plant, or the drug obtained from it.

Supplying includes just sharing it with friends. It does not matter how many plants you have – you could be selling just one, or sharing the pod of just one prohibited type of poppy plant.

If you have 10 or more prohibited plants, even though there is no evidence that you are selling or supplying, you can be presumed to have the intent to sell or supply the plants or drug obtained from them and you can be charged with possession of, or cultivating a prohibited plant, with intent to sell or supply, which is under the same section of the Act and has the same penalties.

If you are charged under this section and the plants/drug obtained from the plants is cannabis only (and not resin or any other derivative), or the plants are the 2 types of prohibited poppy listed in the Act, the charge can be dealt with by the Magistrates Court or by a higher court. If it is dealt with by the Magistrates Court the penalty is a maximum fine of \$5,000 and/or 4 years imprisonment.

Your charge cannot be dealt with by the Magistrates Court if you have 20 or more cannabis plants, or if you have 100 or more of either of the types of poppy plants. It becomes an “indictable only” charge. It must go to a higher court to be dealt with.

Then, the maximum penalty if the plants are only cannabis is a \$20,000 fine and/or 10 years imprisonment. The maximum penalty for any other prohibited plant, such as the prohibited poppies, is \$100,000 and/or 25 years imprisonment.

There is also “mandatory” sentencing (which means that the Court must give these sentences) for the offence of sell or supply or offer to sell or supply a prohibited plant of any sort where the accused person is an adult at the time and the person they are offering or giving it to is a child under 18 years. For a first offence, the penalty must be suspended or conditional suspended imprisonment or imprisonment. For a subsequent offence, there must be imprisonment for at least 6 months.

Sell or supply, or offer to sell or supply, a thing knowing it will be used in the hydroponic cultivation of prohibited plants

This charge can be dealt with in either the Magistrates Court or a higher court. The maximum fine is \$2,000 and/or 2 years imprisonment if dealt with by the Magistrates Court. The maximum fine is \$20,000 and/or 5 years imprisonment if dealt with by a higher court. The court can also order that the convicted person not be allowed to sell or supply anything that can be used for the hydroponic cultivation of plants for up to 2 years. It is a simple offence if this order is breached.

Pelanggaran drug dan kamu II– pelanggaran yang berkenaan dengan pokok terlarang

Majalah-majalah pendek ini tentang perkara-perkara hukum yang mungkin menarik perhatian kamu. Ia bukan nasihat undang-undang. Kamu harus selalu mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang untuk keadaan kamu.

Ini majalah kedua dalam berberapa majalah tentang pelanggaran drug menurut kedua-dua undang-undang WA berdasarkan state yang digunakan di Pulu Christmas dan Cocos (Keeling) dan dibawa undang-undang Commonwealth. Majalah awal-awal ini menerangkan tentang pelanggaran dibawa undang-undang yang digunakan berdasarkan state Misuse of Drugs Act 1981 (WA)(CI). Kita akan panggil 'Act'.

Dalam majalah pertama kita bincangkan tentang drug terlarang dan tempat dan peralatan drug. Dalam majalah ini kami akan bincangkan tentang pelanggaran jenayah yang berkenaan dengan pokok-pokok terlarang dibawa Act.

Apa itu pokok-pokok terlarang?

Act menerangkan ini sebagai pokok yang drug yang boleh berketagihan boleh dibuat darinya, dan pokok-pokok yang didaftar dalam Schedule 2 dalam Act (2 jenis poppies dan cannabis). "Drug yang boleh ketagihan" diterangkan selanjutnya dalam Act.

Offences to do with prohibited plants

Seorang boleh didenda dengan pelanggaran 'simple' bila memiliki atau menanam pokok yang terlarang. Pelanggaran boleh diurus oleh Magistrates Court dan tidak mahkamah lebih tinggi. Pelanggaran ini menarik denda sebesar \$2,000 dan/atau dipenjarakan hingga 2 tahun.

Menjual atau menyediakan, atau menawarkan untuk jualan atau persediaan, sebuah pokok terlarang atau drug yang dihasilkan darinya, atau memiliki dengan niat untuk dijual atau drug yang dihasilkan darinya

Ini adalah dakwaan yang lebih berat. Dibawa bahagian ini dalam Act, kamu boleh didakwa dengan menjual atau menyediakan tanaman yang terlarang, atau drug yang dihasilkan darinya. Kamu juga boleh didakwa kerana menawarkan untuk jual atau menyediakan tanaman terlarang, atau drug yang dihasilkan darinya.

Menyediakan bermaksud hanya perkongsian (sharing) dengan kawan-kawan. Tak kira berapa pokok kamu ada - kamu mungkin menjual satu, atau kongsi kumpulan pokok salahsatu jenis poppy yang terlarang.

Kalau kamu ada 10 atau lebih pokok-pokok terlarang, walaupun tidak ada bukti yang kamu jual atau menyiapkan saja, kamu boleh dianggap mempunyai tujuan untuk menjual atau menyediakan pokok-pokok itu atau drug yang didapati darinya dan kamu boleh didakwa dengan memiliki, atau menanam tanaman terlarang, tujuan untuk dijual atau disediakan, yang dibawa bahagian sama dalam Act dan mempunyai denda yang sama.

Kalau kamu didakwa dibawak bahagian ini dan tanaman/drug yang didapati dari tanaman itu adalah cannabis saja (dan bukan sisah resin atau If you are charged under this section and the plants/drug obtained from the plants is cannabis only (and not resin or keaslian dari selainnya), atau pokok-pokok itu adalah 2 jenis poppy terlarang dalam daftaran Act, dakwaan boleh diurus oleh Magistrates Court atau lebih tinggi. Kalau perkara ini diurus oleh Magistrates Court dendaan terbesar adalah \$5,000 dan/atau 4 tahun dipenjarakan.

Dakwaan kamu tidak boleh diurus oleh Magistrates Court kalau kamu mempunyai lebih dari 20 pokok cannabis, atau kamu mempunyai lebih dari 100 diantara pokok-pokok poppy. Ia menjadi dakwaan "yang dapat dituduh saja". Ia mesti dibawak ke court lebih tinggi untuk diurus.

Jadi, denda paling besar jika pokok-pokok itu hanya cannabis adalah denda \$20,000 dan/atau 10 tahun dipenjarakan. Denda terbesar untuk pokok-pokok terlarang yang lain, seperti poppies terlarang, adalah denda \$100,000 dan/atau 25 tahun dipenjarakan.

Ada juga hukuman "wajib" (yang bermakna Mahkamah mesti memberi hukuman ini) untuk kesalahan menjual atau menyediakan apa saja jenis pokok terlarang dimana orang yang dituduh adalah dewasa dimasa itu dan orang yang ditawarkan atau diberikan itu adalah anak-anak dibawa 18 tahun. Untuk kesalahan pertama, dendanya mesti penjara ditangguhkan atau syarat tergantung ataupun dipenjarakan. Untuk kesalahan seterusnya, mesti dipenjarakan untuk sekurang-kurangnya 6 bulan.

Menjual atau menyediakan, atau ditawarkan untuk jualan atau persediaan, sesuatu diketahui akan digunakan dalam tanaman hydroponic pokok-pokok terlarang

Dakwaan ini boleh di urusi antara di Magistrates Court atau mahkamah lebih tinggi. Dendaan terbesar ialah \$2,000 dan/atau 2 tahun dipenjarakan jika diurus oleh Magistrates Court. Dendaan terbesar ialah \$20,000 dan/atau 5 tahun dipenjarakan jika diurus oleh mahkamah lebih tinggi. Mahkamah juga boleh memerintah orang yang dihukum tidak boleh menjual atau menyediakan apapun yang boleh digunakan untuk tanaman hydroponic pokok untuk 2 tahun. Ia adalah pelanggaran yang ringan kalau perintahan ini dilanggar.



'Home Safety for Baby' video showing near you

Consumer Protection has been working with the State-Government-run satellite TV service Westlink, to produce a video called 'Home Safety for Baby'. This 15 minute film features representatives from Kidsafe WA, the Royal Life Saving Society of WA, Red Nose and Consumer Protection's Principal Product Safety Officer, Luke Eaton.

The 'Home Safety for Baby' video covers product safety issues in the home and outlines the risks for babies and toddlers. The film aims to help prevent accidents, which can lead to injuries or fatalities and provides tips for parents and carers are to do with baths, curtain and blind cords, button batteries, furniture, child car seats and more.

'Home Safety for Baby' is being shown from 11-30 September at three different times of the day at many Community Resource Centres, schools and training or education facilities in regional and remote Western Australia.

Home safety for baby

Takeaway tips



Curtains and blinds:

- Cords are secured with tensioners or wall cleats
- Cords have no loops 1.6 m or less from the floor
- Cots, furniture and climbable items are situated away from any cords, including electrical cords

Safe sleeping:

- Cot complies with the current mandatory standard*
- Mattress is tight fitting and firm
- No items like toys, pillows or loose blankets are in the cot
- Cot wheels are locked into place
- No padded cot bumpers

Button batteries:

- Items with button batteries are out of sight and reach of children
- Battery compartments can't be opened by a child, even with rough play

Falling furniture:

- All potentially hazardous furniture is secured with straps, angle braces or anchors
- TVs are secured to the wall or TV cabinets using specially designed safety fasteners

Toys:

- Toys don't have small parts that a child can pull off and inhale, ingest or insert
- Babies and toddlers can't access toys for older children

Car seats:

- Car seat is age and height appropriate
- Car seat has been fitted correctly
- Car seat was made within the last 10 years and hasn't been in a crash

Pools and spas:

- Pool or spa deeper than 30 cm is fenced off
- Gate closes properly from any position
- Children taught not to swim or bathe without an adult
