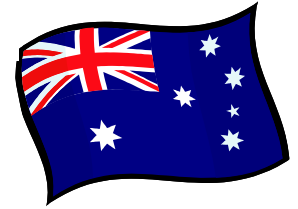

Every bit of plastic ever made still exists and in the first 10 years of this century the world economy produced more plastic than the entire 1900's!

With solutions - more than 6 out of 10 of us are already refusing plastic shopping bags, avoiding pre-packed fruit and veg, picking up other people's litter and avoiding buying bottled water.

Choosing to be part of the solution, you can act by:

- Avoiding products in plastic packaging (choose alternatives)
- Reducing where possible (opt for refills, remember your reusable shopping bags)
- Refusing plastics that escape as litter (e.g. straws, takeaway cups, utensils, balloons)
- Recycling what cannot be avoided

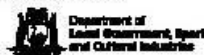

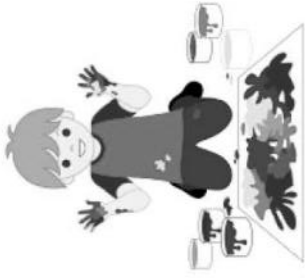

Recent changes to restraining orders law I

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

Courts can make “restraining orders”. A restraining order is a Court order to stop someone behaving in certain (violent or bad) ways towards you. A restraining order must be obeyed, or the person breaking it commits a criminal offence. We published 2 articles about violence, police and misconduct restraining orders in The Atoll approximately 18 months ago. Copies of those articles in Cocos Malay or English are available from the CRC or Darling Elat. They explained these orders, the grounds for getting them and the penalties for breaching them.

All types of restraining order usually stop the other person communicating with you in any way (eg speaking to you, telephoning you, sending you letters, emails or text messages, or contacting you by social media), coming near you, or coming near where you live, work or study.

The *Restraining Orders Act 1997* (ROA) has been amended (changed) in various ways. The last changes operate from 1 July 2017. This article and the next two will explain some of the changes.

One significant change is to make a new type of violence restraining order called a family violence restraining order (FVRO) and to widen the definition of family violence.

Before the changes, violence restraining orders (VROs), used to include orders made in situations of:

- family and domestic violence (where there was a family and domestic relationship between the parties) or
- personal violence (where there was no family relationship eg work colleagues, ex-friends, neighbours).

If you made an application for a family and domestic VRO before the 1 July 2017 and your case is still at court some of the old law still applies.

From 1 July 2017, there are FVROs for family violence situations and VROs for violence in situations where there is no family relationship. Also the idea of family “and domestic” violence has been removed – it is now called family violence. The penalty for breaching (breaking) a FVRO is the same as for breaching a VRO or police order – a \$6,000 fine and/or up to 2 years imprisonment.

Family violence restraining orders (FVROs)

The definition of family violence has been widened to include:

- Violence or the threat of violence by someone to a family member or
- Any other behaviour by that person that controls or coerces the family member or causes them to be fearful.

Eggs of what family violence would now include are:

- assaulting/sexually assaulting/sexually abusive behaviour (eg hitting, kicking, pulling hair, punching, sexual assault)
- kidnapping or deprivation of liberty (eg stopping you from leaving, such as from your house)
- damaging property, including injuring or killing your animals
- publishing/threatening to publish/distribute intimate personal images
- repeated derogatory remarks (eg swearing at you, calling you ugly names, saying nasty things about you)
- stalking or cyber-stalking (eg following you around, sending you endless text messages, telephoning you constantly, contacting you or trolling through social media)
- withholding financial support when you are entirely or mainly dependent on the person (eg if your spouse works and you don't and they refuse you money to live on)
- denying financial autonomy to a person (eg taking your wage away from you each week, or telling you how you must spend it).
- stopping you keeping in contact with friends, family or culture.

FVROs commence when served on (formally delivered to) the respondent (the person who you have got the order against). There is now one new exception. If the respondent is in prison when the order is made the order starts when it is served but the time it stays in force (for example two years) runs from when the person is released from prison. Another change is that at any time in the proceedings for a FVRO, a respondent may consent (agree) to an order being made which places the usual conditions upon them. This order is called a “conduct agreement order”. It is not a final FVRO, but is taken to be one for the purposes of the ROA. If the respondent agrees to a conduct agreement order being made, they are not admitting any allegations made in the application.

If you think that you need a restraining order against someone, seek legal advice, but if it is urgent contact the Police, or contact the Court to apply immediately.

We will discuss more changes to the ROA in the next two articles.

Biodegradable products or materials are naturally broken down by biological agents, such as bacteria and fungi, into raw materials. The goal of supplementing biodegradable products in your everyday life is to recycle our natural resources and keep the Earth clean and free of growing landfills. According to The Environment Today, not all products that claim to be biodegradable are safe or effective. Some products may produce harmful toxins as they break down while others can take more than 30 years to break down, or cannot break down in landfills.

At Home- You most likely use more biodegradable products on a daily basis in your home than you are consciously aware of. Some of these items include food scraps and coffee grounds, paper towels, toilet paper, newspapers, junk mail, paper plates and cups, clothing and towels. The market for biodegradable household goods is growing fast and there are a number of various products currently being released. Petukaran baru terhadap undang-undang perintah pertahanan I

Ini adalah majalah pendek tentang perkara-perkara perundangan yang mungkin menarik minat kamu. Ia bukan nasihat perundangan. Kamu harus selalu mendapatkan nasihat perundangan untuk keadaan kamu. Mahkamah boleh membuat "perintah pertahanan". Perintah pertahanan adalah perintah dari Mahkamah untuk memberhentikan seorang bersikap cara-cara tertentu (ganas atau jahat) terhadap kamu. Sebuah perintah pertahanan mesti di turutkan, atau seorang yang melanggar itu membuat pelanggaran jenayah. Kami telah mengeluarkan 2 majalah tentang keganasan, police dan pertahanan perbuatan buruk dalam The Atoll kira-kira 18 bulan yang lalu. Salinan majalah ini dalam bahasa Melayu Cocos atau English disediakan di CRC atau Darling Elat. Majalah tersebut menerangkan pemerintahan ini, keadaan yang mendapatkannya dan hukuman-hukuman pelanggarannya.

Semua jenis perintah pertahanan ini biasanya memberhentikan seorang itu berkomunikasi dengan kamu dalam cara apa saja (contohnya bicara dengan kamu, menelefon kamu, kirim kamu surat, email atau sms, atau hubungi kamu melalui social media), datang dekat dengan kamu, atau datang dekat tempat tinggal, kerjaan atau sekolah kamu. Restraining Orders Act 1997 (ROA) telah ditukar dalam beberapa cara. Petukaran kemarin bermula digunakan dari 1 July 2017. Majalah ini dan dua majalah seterusnya akan menerangkan beberapa petukaran ini.

Satu petukaran besar ialah untuk membuat jenis pertahanan keganasan baru yang dinamakan perintah pertahanan keganasan keluarga (FVRO) dan untuk meluaskan keterangan keganasan keluarga.

Sebelum petukaran, perintah pertahanan keganasan (VROs), dahulunya termasuk perintah terhadap keadaan:

- keganasan keluarga dan rumahtangga (dimana ada perhubungan keluarga dan rumahtangga diantara pihak-pihak berkenaan) atau
- keganasan peribadi (dimana tidak ada perhubungan keluarga, contohnya rakan kerja, kawan lama, jiran).

Kalau kamu membuat laporan untuk VRO keluarga dan rumahtangga sebelum 1 July 2017 dan kes kamu masih di mahkamah separuh undang-undang yang lama masih digunakan. Dari 1 July 2017, ada FVROs untuk keadaan keganasan keluarga dan VROs untuk keganasan dalam keadaan dimana tidak ada perhubungan keluarga. Dan juga idea keganasan keluarga "dan rumahtangga" telah dibatalkan— ianya sekarang dipanggil keganasan keluarga. Hukuman untuk melanggar FVRO adalah sama sebagai melanggar VRO atau perintah police - sebuah denda \$6,000 dan/atau hingga 2 tahun dipenjarakan.

Perintah pertahanan keganasan keluarga (FVROs)

Penerangan keganasan keluarga telah diluaskan untuk mengandungi:

- Keganasan atau ancaman keganasan oleh seorang terhadap seorang dari keluarga atau
- Tingkah laku lainnya oleh seorang yang kontrol atau memaksa seorang dari keluarga atau menyebabkan mereka ketakutan.

Contoh-contoh keganasan keluarga sekarang akan termasuk:

- menyerang/memperkosakan/tingkah laku kasar (contohnya memukul, menendang, menjambak, menumbuk, serangan seksual)
- pencurikkan atau kekurangan kebebasan (menahan kamu untuk pergi, contohnya daripada rumah kamu)
- merusakkan hartabenda, termasuk mencederahkan atau membunuh binatang piaraan kamu
- menerbitkan/ancaman untuk menerbitkan/mengeluarkan gambar-gambar peribadi
- ucapan penghinaan yang berulang (contohnya memaki kamu, memanggil kamu nama-nama yang buruk, berkata-kata keji tentang kamu)
- mengirim atau 'cyber-stalking' (contohnya mengiring kamu keliling, mengirim kamu text tak berenti-berenti, menelefon kamu tak berenti-berenti, menghubungi kamu atau memerhatikan kamu melalui social media)
- menahan bantuan kewangan bila kamu bergantung keseluruhnya terhadap orang itu (contohnya kalau isteri/suami bekerja dan mereka menolak memberi kamu duit untuk terus hidup)
- menafikan autonomi kewangan kepada seorang (contohnya mengambil gaji kamu daripada kamu setiap minggu, atau menyuruh bagaimana kamu membelanjanya).
- berentikan kamu mempunyai teman, keluarga atau kebudayaan.

FVROs bermula bila pemerintahan diberikan kepada pihak yang dituduh. Sekarang ada satu kecualinya. Kalau pihak yang dituduh sedang dalam penjara bila pemerintahan dibuat dimulakan akan tetap dijalankan (contohnya untuk two tahun) biamana orangnya dikeluarkan dari penjara. Satu lagi petukaran ialah dalam bilamana dalam perjalanan untuk FVRO, pihak yg dituduh boleh mengizinkan (bersetuju) untuk sebuah pemerintahan dibuat yang menetapkan syarat-syarat tertentu terhadap mereka. Pemerintahan ini dipanggil "conduct agreement order". Ia bukan FVRO terakhir, tetapi ia diambil sebahagian daripada tujuan ROA. Kalau pihak yang dituduh bersetuju untuk menjalankan persetujuan dibuat, mereka tidak mengakui segala tuduhan yang dibuat dalam pemohonannya.

Kalau kamu rasa kamu memerlukan pemerintahan pertahanan terhadap seorang, cari nasihat legal, tetap kalau tidak mustahak hubungi Police, atau hubungi Mahkamah untuk memohonnya dengan segera.

Kami akan bincangkan petukaran terhadap ROA dalam dua majalah seterusnya.
