REACT

- Take note/record location of the nest
- Mark nest location if safe to do so
- Move away from the nest location. Wasps can attack en-masse and will sting repeatedly.
- DO NOT attempt to destroy nests on your own. This can cause the wasps to splinter and create more nests. Happy Jacks and Shire rangers have appropriate PPE and insecticides and will attend and control the nests.
- REPORT all nests, including fallen nests on the ground

NORTHERN TERRITORY REMAINS ENTITLED TO TWO FEDERAL ELECTORAL DIVISIONS

At the next general election, the Northern Territory's two federal electoral divisions of Lingiari and Solomon will again be contested. The boundaries of the two electoral divisions will be exactly the same as those contested at the 2019 federal election.

The federal electoral divisions in the Northern Territory will be:

Division of Lingiari	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the Alice Springs Municipality, Barkly Shire, Belyuen Community Council, Central Desert Shire, Coomalie Community Government Council, East Arnhem Shire, Katherine Municipality, Litchfield Municipality, MacDonnell Shire, Roper Gulf Shire, Victoria Daly Shire, Wagait Shire, West Arnhem Shire and West Daly Region, • the towns of Alyangula, Nhulunbuy and Yulara, • the unincorporated areas north and east of Litchfield Municipality, south-east of Coomalie Shire, and west of Litchfield and Palmerston Municipalities, • part of the Palmerston Municipality, specifically the suburbs of Farrar, Johnston, Mitchell, Yarrowonga and Zuccoli, • Tiwi Islands, • Groote Eylandt, • the Territory of Christmas Island, and • the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands
Division of Solomon	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the Darwin Municipality, • the Palmerston Municipality, with the exception of the suburbs of Farrar, Johnston, Mitchell, Yarrowonga and Zuccoli, and • the unincorporated areas of the Darwin Rates Act Area and East Arm

A determination of state and territory membership entitlement in the House of Representatives made in July 2020 decreased the Northern Territory's entitlement from two seats to one seat.

However, in February 2021, an amendment to the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* came into force that set aside this determination, meaning that the Northern Territory is once again entitled to two seats, with identical boundaries to those contested at the 2019 federal election.

You can check your enrolment online at www.aec.gov.au/check. For privacy reasons, your electoral enrolment will only be confirmed if the details you enter are an exact match to your details on the electoral roll.

New scalping laws are just the ticket

Gone are the days in Western Australia where if you had your heart set on attending a sold-out event or concert you would have little choice but to fork-out hundreds of dollars more for a ticket than it was originally worth.

This is because new ticket scalping laws have taken effect that restricts the resale of tickets to a maximum ten per cent mark-up from the original price. Also outlawed is the use of software known as 'bots' that bypass security measures to make bulk ticket purchases.

Aside from putting restrictions on price gouging by ticket scalpers, re-sellers will also be required to identify the location of the seat or viewing spot for each ticket.

It is now Consumer Protection's role to enforce the new measures and the Commissioner has sent notices to seven online re-sellers advising them of the new laws and heavy penalties they could face for failing to comply. Fines ranging from \$20,000 for individuals and \$100,000 for companies await those who break the law, with even higher penalties applying for those using 'bots' to purchase tickets.

While the new laws will go a long way towards ensuring fairer ticket prices in the resale market, our best advice is for consumers to only buy tickets from authorised sellers to protect their refund rights if the event is postponed or cancelled.

Purchasing via re-sellers, particularly if they are based overseas, can be risky as people may find that their tickets are either invalid or fake and they are denied entry to the event when they turn up. Also remember that re-sellers often pay to be on top of internet search results, so look beyond them when searching online.

Undang-undang 'scalping' baru hanyalah tiketnya

Lewat sudah hari-hari di Australia Barat dimana jika anda ingin menghadiri acara atau konsert yang terjual habis, anda tidak akan mempunyai banyak pilihan selain membayar lebih daripada ratusan dolar untuk tiket dari harga asalnya.

Ini kerana undang-undang 'scalping' tiket baru telah berlaku yang membatasi penjualan semula tiket hingga mark-up maksimum sepuluh persen dari harga asal. Juga dilarang adalah penggunaan software yang dikenal sebagai 'bot' yang memotong langkah keselamatan untuk melakukan pemborongan tiket.

Selain melakukan pembatasan terhadap harga yang dikenakan oleh penipu tiket, penjual semula juga akan diminta untuk mengenal pasti lokasi tempat duduk atau tempat menonton setiap tiket.

Sekarang adalah tugas Perlindungan Pengguna untuk menegakkan langkah-langkah baru dan Commissioner telah mengirimkan pemberitahuan kepada tujuh penjual semula secara online yang menasihati mereka mengenai undang-undang baru dan hukuman berat yang mungkin mereka hadapi kerana tidak mematuhi. Denda mulai dari \$20,000 untuk individu dan \$100,000 untuk kompani yang melanggar undang-undang, dengan hukuman yang lebih tinggi dikenakan bagi mereka yang menggunakan 'bot' untuk membeli tiket.

Walaupun undang-undang baru akan memastikan harga tiket yang lebih adil di pasaran penjualan semula, nasihat terbaik kami adalah pengguna hanya membeli tiket dari penjual yang sah untuk melindungi hak pengembalian uang mereka sekiranya acara ditangguhkan atau dibatalkan.

Membeli melalui penjual semula, terutamanya jika mereka terletak di luar negara, boleh berisiko kerana orang mungkin mendapati bahawa tiket mereka tidak sah atau palsu dan mereka dilarang masuk ke acara itu ketika mereka sampeh. Ingat juga bahawa penjual semula sering membayar untuk berada di atas hasil carian internet, jadi lihat di luar mereka ketika mencari secara online.

Community Update

Pulu Keeling National Park



Update on the blue tailed skink release on Pulu Blan

September 7th was National Threatened Species Day. It also marked two years since 300 Christmas Island blue-tailed skinks were translocated to Pulu Blan. To monitor and assess the survival of the skink population since their release, Kristen and Callum from CINP spent the last few weeks capturing, measuring and weighing the skinks, and then releasing them back to where they were found. Through this method, they could assess the skinks' health and body condition to make sure they have adequate resources for survival and to detect any signs of predation, as well as estimate the current size of the population on Pulu Blan. Parks are pleased to report that the population is booming and is now three times the size of the population that was released two years ago. The skinks appear to be healthy and are found in all habitats where there are sunny spots to bask!

Parks Australia would like to thank Shire of Cocos Keeling, Nek Fifi and family and the Cocos community on their continued support for the blue-tailed skink project. A special thank you to Ash and Kylie James from Cocos Adventure Tours who will be working in partnership with Parks in a citizen science program to monitor the blue-tailed skinks.

If visiting Blan or Blan Madar, please remember to check your boat and belongings for unwanted pests like rats, giant centipedes and the Macao paper wasp, to maximise the skinks' chance of survival.

Berita tentang pelepasan blue tailed skink di Pulu Blan

7 September adalah National Threatened Species Day. Ia juga menandakan dua tahun semenjak 300 Christmas Island blue-tailed skinks dipindahkan ke Pulu Blan. Untuk menjaga dan menilai kelangsungan hidup skink sejak dibebaskan, Kristen dan Callum dari CINP menghabiskan beberapa minggu terakhir untuk menangkap, mengukur dan menimbang skink tersebut, dan kemudian melepaskannya kembali ke tempat mereka ditemui. Melalui cara ini, mereka dapat menilai kesihatan dan kondisi tubuh skinks untuk memastikan mereka memiliki sumber daya yang cukup untuk bertahan hidup dan untuk mengesan tanda-tanda pemangsa, serta memperkirakan ukuran populasi semasa di Pulu Blan. Parks dengan senang hati melaporkan bahawa populasi meningkat dan sekarang tiga kali lebih banyak daripada jumlah yang dibebaskan dua tahun lalu. Skinks kelihatan sihat dan terdapat di semua habitat di mana tempat yang terang untuk berjemur!

Parks Australia ingin mengucapkan terima kasi kepada Konsel Pulu Cocos, Nek Fifi dan keluarga serta masyarakat atas sokongan berterusan mereka untuk projek blue-tailed skink ini. Ucapan terima kasi khas kepada Ash dan Kylie James dari Cocos Adventure Tours yang akan bekerjasama dengan Parks dalam citizen science program untuk menjaga blue-tailed skinks.

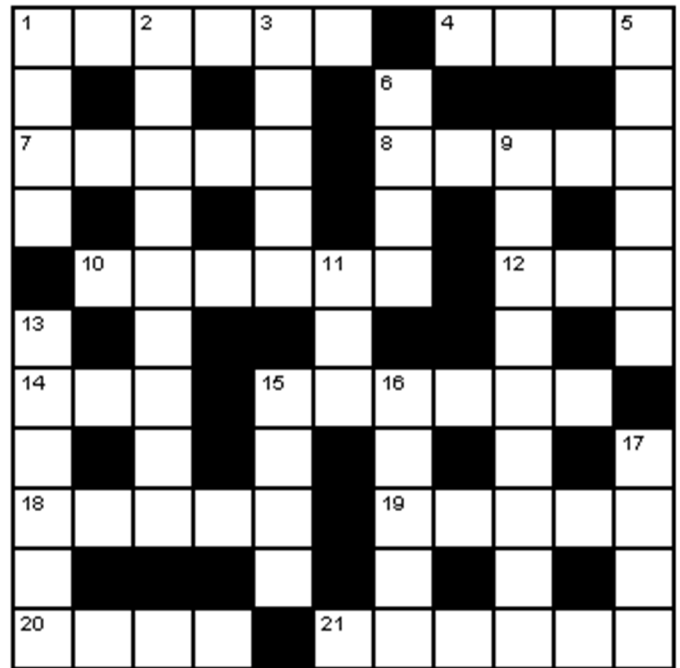
