Cocos (Keeling) Islands Coastal Vulnerability Assessment

The Australian Government, in collaboration with the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, and the Western Australian Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage has commenced a project to determine the vulnerability of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands to coastal hazards, including erosion and storm surge inundation.

The overall objective of the project is to identify coastal hazard risks and vulnerability of built and natural assets, in order to properly plan for adaptive land use and development on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands in light of a changing coastal environment.

During 2018 - 2019, the Project Team will be collecting wave and current data (both inside the lagoon and ocean side of the atoll) which will be used to identify the coastal hazards for the Cocos (Keeling) Islands. Coastal hazards will be assessed at present and future predicted sea levels to determine what built and natural assets, and their cultural, social, environmental and economic values, are at risk over time. This project will deliver a report and maps of the hazards, showing what areas may be impacted by erosion or inundation.

Regular updates will be provided during the project through 'The Atoll' newsletter.

Pulu Cocos (Keeling) Pernilaian Membahayakan Pesisiran Laut

Government Australia dalam berkerjasama dengan Shire Pulu Cocos Keeling serta Departmen Perancangan, Tanah dan Warisan Australia Barat telah memulakan projek untuk menentukn sama ada persisiran laut Kepulauan Cocos Keeling akan menjadi membahayakan, dan tercemar dari akibat erosi tanah disebabkan dari terhampas gelombang.

Objektif secara keseluruhan projek ini adalah untuk mengenali risiko dan hal-hal membahayakan yang berlaku di persisiran laut sama ada bagai aset yang dibangunkan maupun yang semula jadi, untuk membenakan perancangan dengan benar dalam penggunaan tanah dan bangunan di Pulu Cocos Keeling dimasa yang akan datang dalam keadaan lingkungan persisiran laut yang berubah saat ini.

Pada masa 2018 - 2019, Tim Projek akan mengutip data dari ombak dan arus laut (di luar dan dalam lagoon di sekitar pulu) yang akan digunakan untuk mengenali hal-hal yang membahayakan pada persisiran laut di Pulu Cocos Keeling. Persisiran laut yang membahayakan akan di nilai dari masa sekarang dengan prediksi permukaan laut dimasa mendatang untuk memastikan aset yang dibangunkan dan semula jadi, dan budaya mereka, social, lingkungan dan nilai ekonomi yang berisiko seiring waktu. Projek ini akan menghasilkan riport dan map yang menunjukkan tempat-tempat dimana yang mungkin akan berisiko akibat erosi.

Kemajuan tentang selama projek ini berlangsung akan di kabarkan melalui surat bultin Atoll dari masa ke masa.

Community Social Work Service

Narelle Whatley has recently taken up the appointment of community social worker with the Indian Ocean Territories Health Service (IOTHS). Narelle, along with her partner and daughter, recently moved from Tasmania to Christmas Island. Since arriving in the IOT in February, Narelle and her family have been enjoying the gorgeous weather by spending their time snorkelling and exploring the many stunning outdoor spaces of the IOT.

Narelle holds a Bachelor Arts majoring in Psychology and a Bachelor of Social Work with first class honours from the University of Tasmania. She has over ten years social work experience working in a number of settings including primary and high schools, hospitals and providing trauma-informed counselling to children impacted by family violence. Narelle is also in the final stages of a PhD candidature researching childhood experiences of domestic abuse.

Narelle has the privilege of taking over from the previous social worker Andres Leal and will work closely with the IOTHS to enhance and maintain the social, physical and psychological wellbeing of individuals, families and communities. Specific duties included in this role will include counselling, case management, assessment, care planning, advocacy, facilitation of access to resources and assistance in the recovery from mental and physical illness. Narelle will also assist in providing support programs for people who are seeking to change unwanted behaviours for people on community service orders as required by the magistrate.

Narelle's role on Cocos (Keeling) Island will be slightly less direct than those services provided on Christmas Island. Darling Elat, as the Community Services Officer, will be the person on the ground providing many of the practical services that support the community. Narelle is looking forward to working with Darling to assist in continuing with existing and implementing new community programs within the community.

Community members who live in the IOT are able to access social work services. On CI and CKI members of the community can contact Narelle directly by telephoning

0447 975 436 or **9164 8333** and asking for the social worker. After initial contact, plans can be negotiated on how to work together.

Alternatively, referrals can be forward to Narelle via the health service, school staff and other professionals visiting or working in the area by emailing social.worker@infrastructure.gov.au. The social work service is committed to respecting rights to privacy and maintaining client confidentiality. Members of the community can be assured that their records and information will be held in the strictest confidence.

On a day to day basis the social work service is based at the Christmas Island Health Service at 33 Phosphate Hill Road, Christmas Island. Narelle can be contacted for further information by emailing: narelle.whatley@infrastructure.gov.au.

Dia datang dengan teman lelaki dan anak prepuannya, mereka datang nya dari Tasmania ke Pulu Krismis. Sejak sampai di IOT bulan Febuari, Narelle dan keluarganya suka sekali dengan cuaca di Pulu Krismis dimana mereka boleh pergi selulup dan jalan-jalan di luar untuk diak apa yang ada di IOT.

Narelle memegang ijazah Bachelor Arts dalam Psikologi dan ijazah Bachelor sebagai Kerja Sosial dengan kepujian kelas pertama dari Universiti di Tasmania. Narelle mempunyai lebih dari sepuluh tahun pengalaman kerja sosial dan termasuk bekerja dengan anak-anak di sekolah rendah dan sekolah tinggi, di rumah sakit untuk membantu dan menyediakan kaunseling trauma kepada anak-anak yang tertekan dengan masalah dalam keluarga. Narelle juga sedang berada di masa yang terakhir untuk menghabiskan ijazah PhD nya sebagai orang yang melakukan pemeriksaan untuk anak-anak yang mengalami gangguan domestik.

Narelle memiliki hak keistimewaan untuk mengambil alih dari pekerja sosial sebelumnya, Andres Leal . Narelle akan selalu berkerjasama dengan IOTHS untuk meningkatkan dan mengekalkan kesejahteraan sosial, fizikal dan psikologi untuk seorang, keluarga dan komuniti. Tugas-tugas yang dia akan melaksanakan termasuk kaunseling, pengurusan kes, advokasi, kemudahan untuk mendapat bantuan dalam pemulihan dari penyakit mental dan fizikal. Narelle juga akan membantu dalam menyediakan program sokongan untuk orang yang ingin mengubah tingkah laku untuk orang yang di perintahkan untuk berkhidmat di masyarakat kami yang di suru oleh majistret.

Narelle suda tidak sabar untuk berkerjasama dengan Darling untuk membantu dan meneruskan program yang baru dan yang suda di sediakan untuk dilaksanakan di dalam masyarakat kami.

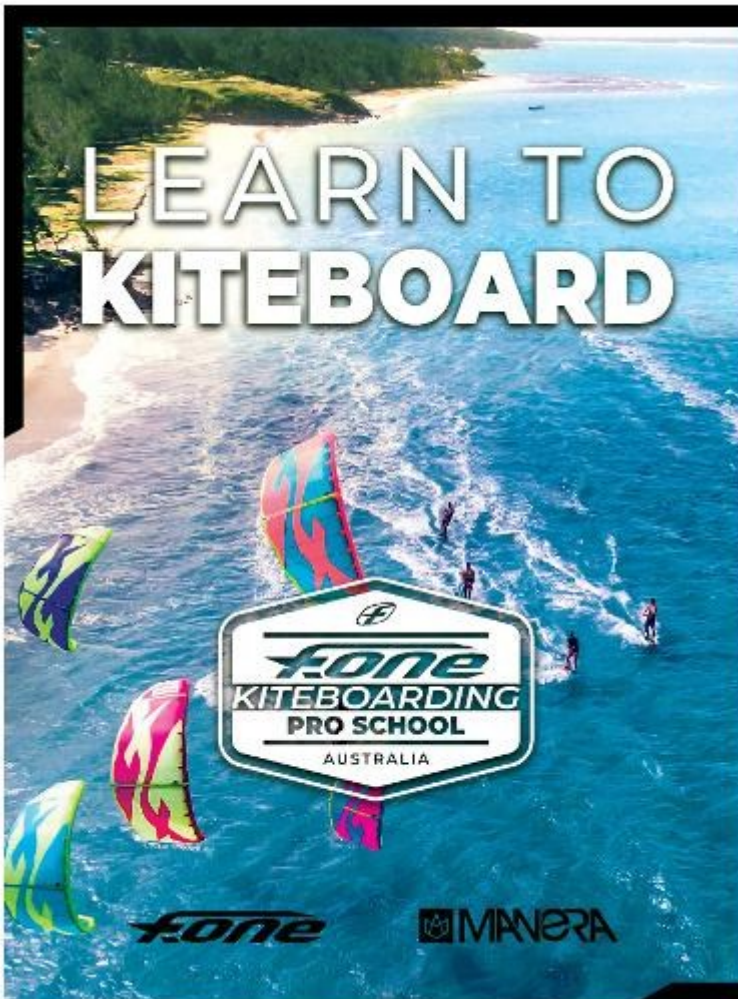



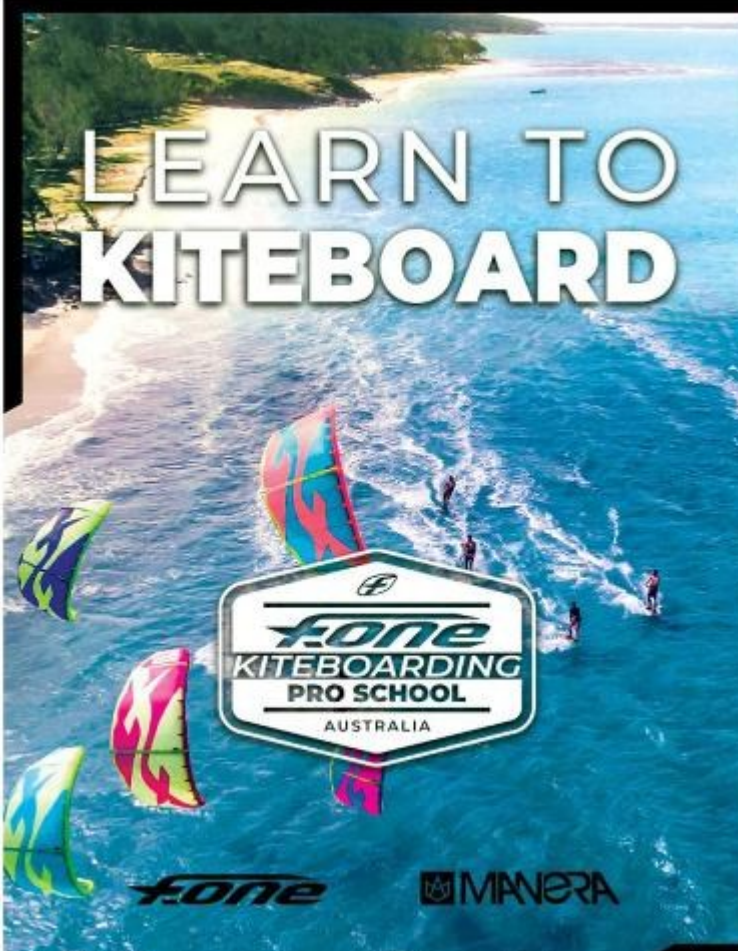

Plastic Bags Ban

WA's ban on lightweight plastic bags.

From 1 July 2018, the supply of lightweight plastic bags will be banned in Western Australia.

Every year billions of lightweight plastic shopping bags are supplied nationally, with around seven million littered in WA alone.

While plastic shopping bags make up a relatively small portion of solid waste and litter, they do not break down and can have devastating impacts on marine wildlife and birds.

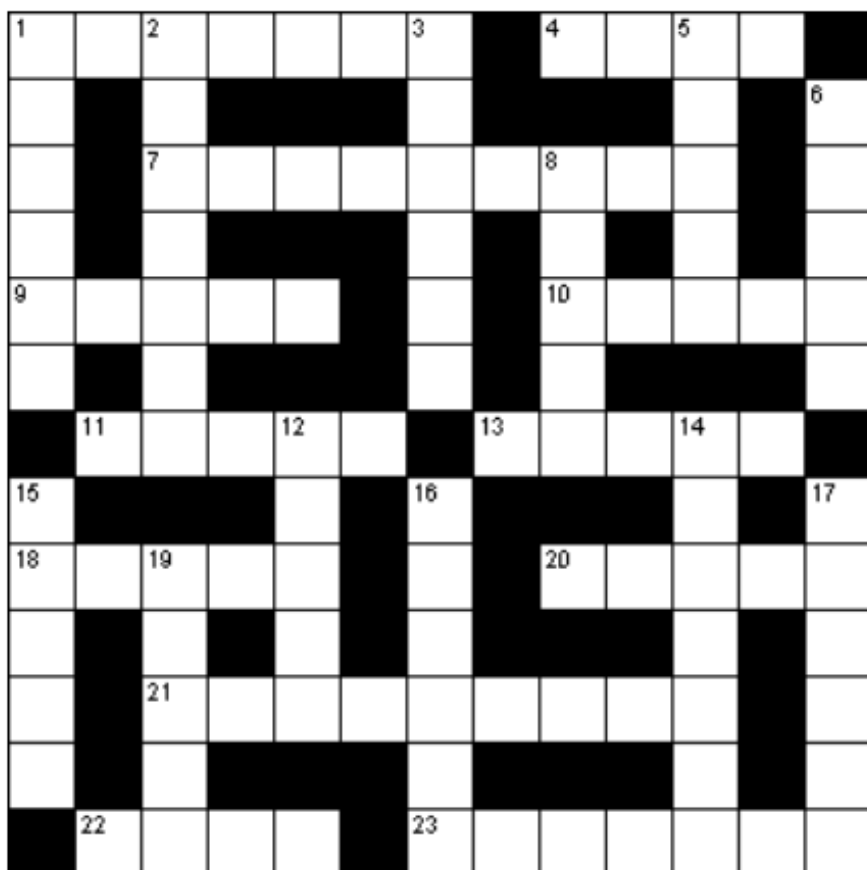
Since its announcement, WA's plastic bag ban has been widely supported by the community and industry, including major retailers—some of the biggest suppliers of lightweight plastic shopping bags.

The ban on lightweight plastic bags will bring WA into line with other Australian states—South Australia, Tasmania, the Northern Territory and Australian Capital Territory already have similar bans in place. Queensland will introduce its ban on 1 July and Victoria has announced its intention to introduce a ban.

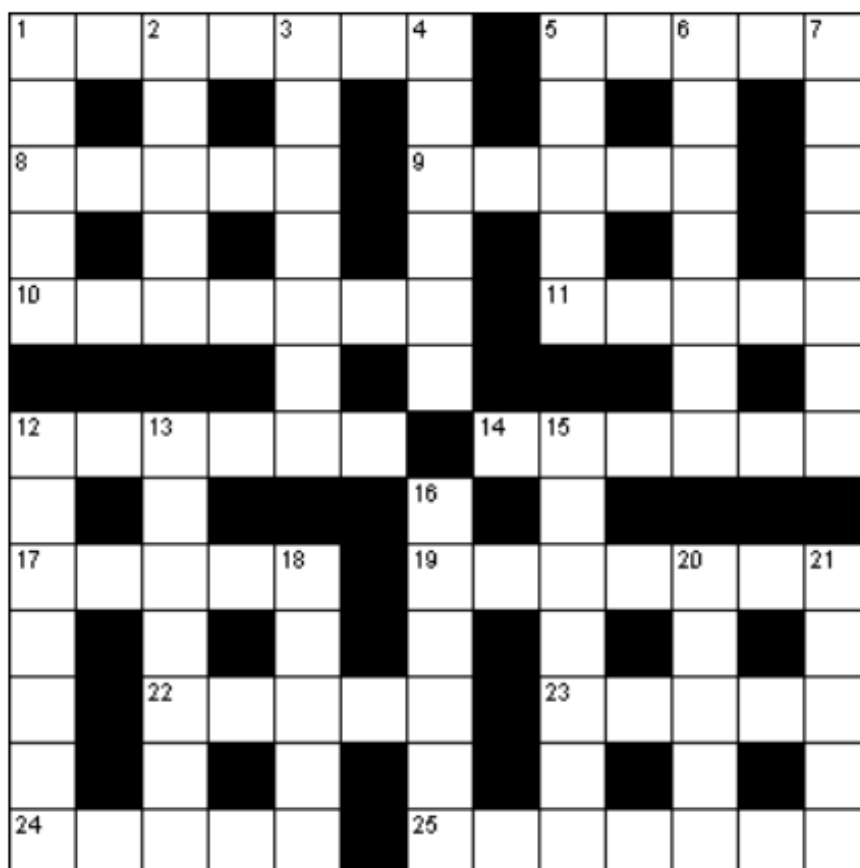

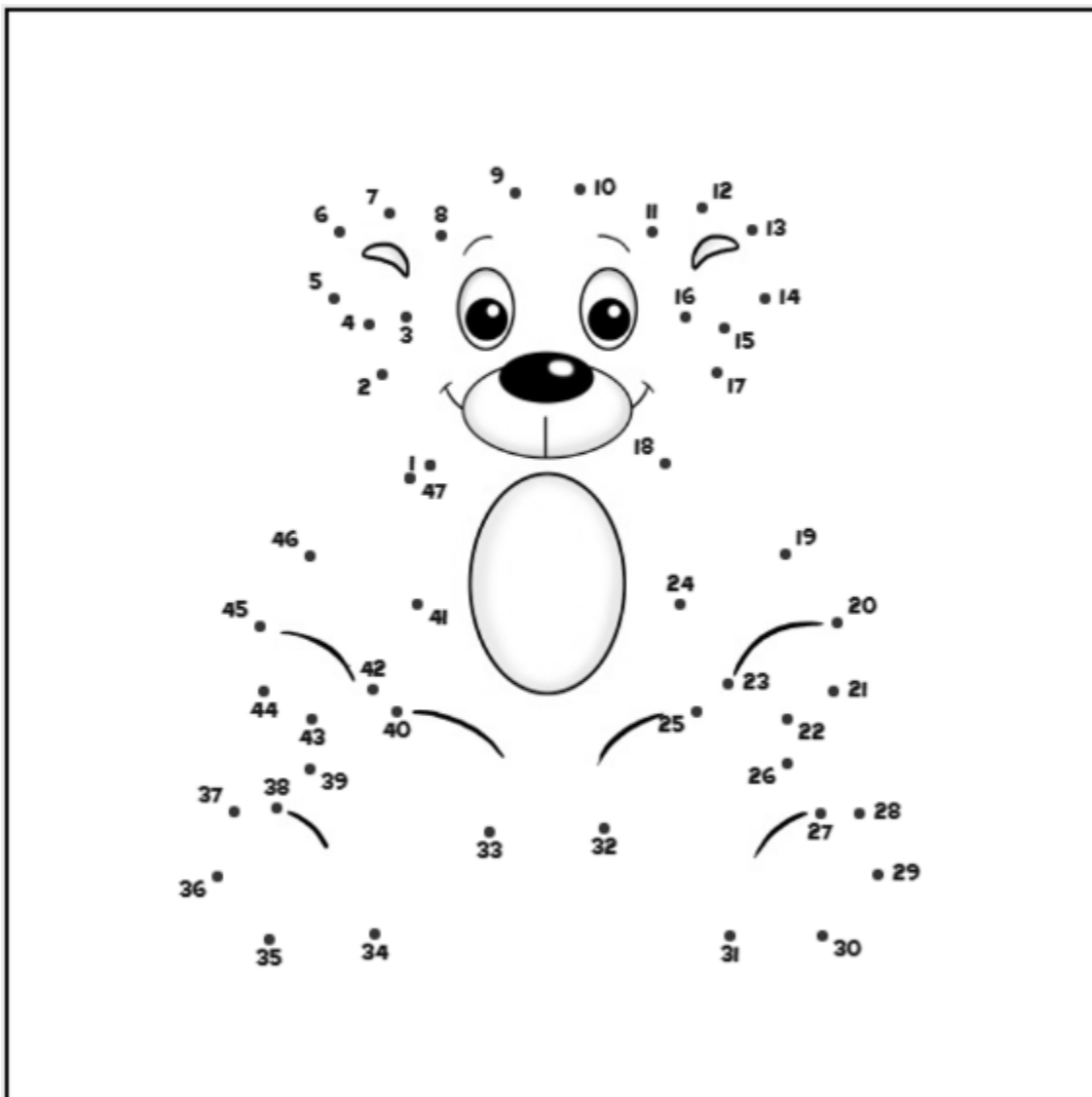
